Latest Developments

AGPS documented the death of 97 Palestinian residents of AlSayeda Zeinab Camp in Rif Dimashq since the outbreak of deadly hostilities in Syria until January 2019.

The list includes 20 Palestinians who died under shelling, 62 who were fatally gunned down, five who were tortured to death, and three others who were killed by snipers. At the same time, a Palestinian refugee was executed and another was killed after he was kidnapped. Four Palestinians died, meanwhile, in car blasts while another died of unknown reasons.



In another development, residents of Jaramana Camp, in Rif Dimashq, said they have run out of and gas and fuel reserves urgently needed for heating and cooking.

Speaking with AGPS, the residents said they registered their names on the line-up list months ago but received no fuel supplies so far.

Only a few residents received a handful of fuel liters. However the bulk of civilians have been deprived of fuel reserves with the advent of a freezing winter.

Jaramana Camp has also has been gripped with an acute dearth in gas. Civilians have been forced to purchase gas at some 10,000 Syrian Pounds a cylinder. The price hike and transportation crisis have made the situation far worse.

Over recent years, residents of Jaramana Camp have launched cries for help over the dire socio-economic conditions, high unemployment rates, poor infrastructure, steep rental fees, and the sharp nosedive in relief assistance by UNRWA and other charities.

In another development, the Commission of Palestinians of Syria for Relief and Development distributed fuel supplies and food boxes donated by the European AlWafa Campaign to displaced families north of Syria.



Some 2,200 Palestinian and Syrian families benefited from the measure, which makes part of a handful of initiatives aiming to assuage the calamitous conditions endured by the Palestinians of Syria during winter.

The European AlWafa Campaign is also about to embark on a so-called “Together for a Warm Winter” campaign in and around Idlib

province. Over 950 displaced Palestinian families are expected to receive 20 liters of fuel each.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Mirvat Kablawi, from AlHusainiya Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Rif Dimashq, has been locked up in Syrian state jails for the fourth consecutive year.

Mirvat was arrested at a government-run checkpoint in AlHusainiya Camp on September 6, 2015. Her fate has been shrouded in mystery.

AGPS documented the imprisonment of 1,728 Palestinian detainees, among them 108 women and girls.
