## Victims

Palestinian refugee “Mohamed Khaled Hamada,” a member of the Liwaa Al-Quds battalion, has died while fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces in the ongoing clashes in the suburbs of Idlib, north of Syria.

On its part, AGPS confirmed that it recorded the data of 966 Palestinian refugees, who have died during their participation in the conflict inside Syria, after being hit by gunshot wounds.



## Latest Developments

Yarmouk camp witnessed the outbreak of intermittent clashes and exchanged sniping, between ISIS and ‘Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham,’ previously known as Al-Nusra Front, yesterday. No injuries occurred on both sides.

According to our correspondent, members of ‘Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham’ regained some of the sites ISIS had taken control of, such as the areas of Haifa Street, Maliki School and Abd Al-Qader Al-Hossaini Mosque. This came after they launched an attack on Sunday-Monday night.

ISIS had launched a surprise attack on Sunday, on ‘Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham’s’ locations in the west of Yarmouk, through which it took control over the headquarters of the Palestinian Charitable Association, Abd Al-Qader Al-Hossini School and a nursery adjacent to the Abd Al-Qader Al-Hossini School, which belongs to ‘Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham,’ leading to a number of deaths and injuries.



In the meantime, the Syrian regime continues to detain Palestinian brothers, “Omar and Montasser Ahmed Ghonayem,” residents of Yarmouk camp, since 2013 and to this date.

According to the detainees’ parents, “Omar Ahmed Ghonayem,” born in 1995 was arrested in 2013, at the Syrian regime and its affiliated factions’ checkpoint, at the beginning of Yarmouk camp.

While “Montasser Ahmed Ghonayem,” born in 1990, was arrested at the “Mashroua Damr” checkpoint in Damascus. No information about their place or conditions of detention have been revealed.

Syrian security forces arrest many Palestinian siblings and families, including women and children, whose fate remains unknown to this moment. Many cases of siblings and families who have died under

torture in the Syrian regime prisons have been recorded, such as the three brothers from the Hamdan family from Yarmouk camp, and the three sisters from the Saad Al-Din family, from the Raml camp.



### **Local Work Committees**

The Palestinians in Syria Relief and Development Association distributed heating materials to the displaced families and residents of Muzayrib town in south Syria.

The aid included firewood and mazut, of which 100 families benefited, according to the Association, under the winter heating project.

The Palestinian refugees in south Syria are suffering from terrible living conditions, due to the violent and continuous bombardments that the region is subjected to, and which has resulted in great damage to the infrastructure, in addition to water and electricity cuts and the lack of medical services.

## **Palestinians of Syria: January 15, 2018 Statistics:**

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3639, including 463 women
- 1653 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,643 days in a row
- 204 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1380 days, and 1220 days in Yarmouk Camp
- The Regime army has been in control of Handarat camp for more than 478 days. More than 80% of its buildings have been completely or partially destroyed.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
