## Latest Developments

Palestinian student Ahmad AlKayali was honored by the Syrian Ministry of Education for creating a smart exam box.

The Education Ministry said the box functions by means of artificial intelligence and serves to set exam questions and correct student responses without human intervention and at a fast pace.

The Education Minister gave instructions for coordination between the concerned departments so as to develop the new hardware for future usage.



Ahmad was raised in Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Damascus. He is a third-year student at the Mohsinia Secondary School in Damascus.

In another development, the Water Company in Daraa, south of Syria, pledged to rehabilitate water networks in the next few days.

The promises were made after a number of residents of Daraa Camp showed up at the office of the director of the Water Company

and updated him on the calamitous situation civilians have been facing in the area.

The delegation held local authorities responsible for the water crisis, saying water supplies have been pumped to other regions at the expense of Daraa residents.



The director promised to work out the crisis at the soonest possible time, saying a boost convertor for electrical transformers has been purchased to increase water pump pressure.

All the way through Syria's eight-year conflict, residents of Daraa Camp for Palestinian refugees, south of Syria, have been grappling with a chronic water blackout, which has been ongoing from the time the opposition outfits seized the camp until the Syrian government forces regained control over it.

The residents have been forced to drink water spouting from contaminated artesian wells or purchasing tanks at prices of up to 1,200 Syrian Pounds.

Daraa Camp is home to over 650 displaced Palestinian families.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Khalil Ibrahim Shakosh, born in 1987, has been enduring a mysterious fate in Syrian state prisons for the fifth year running.

Khalil was kidnapped from his home in Jdeidat Artouz in Rif Dimashq on December 01, 2014 and dragged to an unidentified destination.



Over 1,758 Palestinian refugees have been locked up in Syrian state prisons, where 606 other refugees also died under torture, according to AGPS statistics.

In the meantime, 53 Palestinians from Syria, mostly women, children, and elderly refugees, drowned onboard the death boats to Europe, fleeing the tattered Syrian territories.

A number of casualties breathed their last off the Libyan seashores on way to Italy while others sunk in Marmara waters as they tried to reach the Greek coast. Dozens of migrants have gone missing.
