Latest Developments

The Palestine Liberation Army (PLA) said it has retrieved the bodies of six gunmen withheld by ISIS militias.

The casualties were killed on September 25, 2018 in fierce clashes with ISIS in Teloul AlSafa, in ALSweida desert.

The six fighters are: Mahmoud Yousef Ahmad, Muadh Adnan Abdul Al, Yousef Ahmed Khuza'I, Uwais Mohamed Kheir Maw'ed, Sa'id Nidal AlAsta, and Amar Adnan Issa.



A few weeks earlier, PLA announced the death of 14 members during September 2018. The casualties are: Ihsan Husain Ali AlKhneifas, from AlSayeda Zeinab Camp, Walid Mer'I AlKurdi, the commander of Saeka 412 Brigade, Abdul Karim Melhem Ali, Adnan Abdul Al, Amar Adnan Issa, Thaer Amar Saleh, Mahmoud Youssef Ahmad, Hekmat Naseem Issa, Youssef Ahmad Khuza'I, Tawfiq Ahmad Kasem, Ouways Mohamed Kheir Mawed, Sa'id Nidal AlAsta, Mohamed Mahmoud Teym, and Basel Mohamed Ali.

The gunmen were killed as they fought alongside the Syrian government forces against ISIS militias in the vicinities of Teloul AlSafa town, in AlSweida's eastern desert, south of Syria.

274 PLA fighters have been pronounced dead since the outburst of the Syrian warfare, according to AGPS data.

Meanwhile, news outlets said Liwaa AlQuds battalion, affiliated with the Syrian government, dispatched a commander to Eastern AlGhouta, in Rif Dimashq, after they tasked him with chasing down Palestinian young men for military service.

A so-called Abu Yassin Mandou commander, who arrived in Damascus a few weeks ago coming from Aleppo, forced nearly 50 youths to join pro-government squads.



Newly-recruited gunmen were reportedly offered financial grants and impunity cards issued by the General Intelligence Division prohibiting their arrest and prosecution.

Recently, 30 young men from Eastern AlGhouta were dispatched to Syria's coastal front to fight against the opposition outfits.

Liwaa AlQuds battalion was founded on October 6, 2013 by the Palestinian engineer Mohamed Sa'id, known for his ties with the Air Intelligence in an attempt to derive personal benefits in real estate construction.

In the meantime, AGPS documented the death of 310 Palestinian refugees after they were shot by snipers in the war-ravaged Syrian territories, mostly in Yarmouk Camp, south of Damascus.

At the same time, Palestinian refugee Jamal Waleed ALSayed, born in 1970, has been enduring a mysterious fate in Syrian government dungeons, where he has been held for the fourth year running.

Jamal was kidnapped by Syrian government forces from AlAyedeen Camp in Homs.

AGPS kept record of the incarceration of 1,700 Palestinian refugees in Syrian government prisons, among them 108 women and girls.

Along the same line, tents set up by Palestinian refugees on the Greek island of Samos have been uprooted by the violent winds rocking the region.

Displaced families, including children and women, have been without a roof over their heads as a result of the wild wind.

Dozens of Palestinian refugees have been taking shelter in ramshackle tents in the midst of unsafe forests and rock-strewn grassland, fleeing the over-crowded refugee camps pitched in Greece.

Some 400 Palestinian refugees from Syria have been stranded in makeshift tents and under-equipped halls on such Greek islands as Lesbos, Chios, Leros, and Kos.
