Victims

Palestinian "Samir Adnan Khuzaie," member of the "Fath Al-Intefada" Movement, has died while fighting alongside the regime forces in the ongoing clashes in Syria. Khuzaie is from the Safad District in the Village of Al-Dawara, and a resident of the Jarmana camp for Palestinian refugees in the suburbs of Damascus.



Latest Developments:

After a month and a half of its closure, the armed opposition forces in the south of Damascus opened the Yelda Road - Yarmouk camp in front of the camp's residents.

According to the Action Group's correspondent, the Syrian opposition forces allowed the students of Yarmouk camp to enter Yelda to attend their school and the residents to shop and buy their food supplies and vegetables. The factions allowed the residents to pass through a sub-route leading to Beirut Street in Yelda, while the main crossing remained closed.

In the same context, Palestinian "Aly Dawood" was wounded by a sniper shot near the "Al-Orouba" checkpoint, from an unknown source and was immediately taken to the field hospital for treatment.

While reports from south Damascus noted that the opposition military factions fired shots at the Al-Orouba checkpoint while the civil defense attempted to transfer some of the civilian emergency cases. One of the paramedics sustained minor injuries to his face.

The "Aknaf Beit Al-Maqdes" battalion in the south of Damascus, denied sending any representatives among the civil delegation that went to meet members of the regime, over the past.

The Aknaf confirmed in a statement it issued yesterday, that it is represented only through the political committee of the region, and that the civil status is responsible for the negotiation, not the military one, stressing that the military side does not participate or represent in any negotiating sessions because it could negatively affect the civilian state and aggravate the suffering of the residents of Yarmouk camp.

In its documentational report that was published in October under the title “The Palestinian Student - Reality and Prospects,” AGPS revealed that 6 reasons and obstacles faced the education process and often led to its halt inside the Palestinian camps in Syria.



Bombardments, the fall of mortar shells and snipers, as well as the destruction of the schools and buildings and the continuation of the siege imposed by the Syrian regime army on a number of camps, including Yarmouk camp, in addition to the arrest of students, the migration of educational competencies and professionals, the use of freshly graduated university students without subjecting them to the necessary rehabilitation courses to prepare the teachers and mastering the teaching aids, teaching methods, classroom management and modern teaching techniques.

Palestinians of Syria: November 26, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3613, including 463 women
- 1643 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,593 days in a row
- 204 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1330 days, and 1170 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,666 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 429 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
