Latest Developments

220 Palestinian children were pronounced dead in the raging Syrian warfare, according to AGPS statistics until April 2017.

70 children died as a result of the tough blockade imposed on Yarmouk Camp by the Syrian government forces and the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command since 2013.



According to affidavits by ex-detainees, toddlers clinging to their mothers' arms have been encountered in Syrian prisons.

Meanwhile, former emir (chief) of Tahrir AlSham battalion, called Abu Ibrahim, died of wounds he sustained in clashes with ISIS in Yarmouk Camp.

Reporting from the area, AGPS news correspondent said ISIS militias have unblocked the access road out of and into western Yarmouk, allowing civilians to safely enter and leave zones controlled by ISIS and Fatah AlSham. Sometime earlier, food aids were delivered by the

government forces to Fatah AlSham as part of a recently-struck five-town agreement.

AGPS reporter said civilians were only allowed to enter one loaf of bread per every family member and half a kilogram of foodstuff.

In another development, Thousands of Palestinians sheltered in AlBadawi Camp have launched cries for help over the security mayhem rocking the area.

On Saturday, clashes flared up in AlBadawi Camp after gunmen from AlShaaabi family shot the Popular front for the Liberation of Palestine delegate Adnan Abu Odeh. The clashes claimed the life of one person and left others wounded. Remarkable material damage was also wrought in the process.



As of April 25, tension has been running high in AlBadawi Camp, home to 850 Palestinian families from Syria, following a manhunt for drug gangs.



In the meantime, Palestinian caricaturist from Syria Hani Abbas read part of foreword to his novel, slated to be published in the near future. The novel sheds light on experiences he had gone through in Syria.

The event was held on the sidelines of the International Book Fair held in the Swedish city of Geneva.

Born in 1977 in Yarmouk Camp, in Damascus, Hani Abbas established comics exhibitions since 1998 in Syria and other Arab countries. He has also held over 15 solo exhibitions and won the first prize in the competition of professional painters. In 2014, he earned a renowned international prize.



Palestinians of Syria: April 30, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,485 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,187 Palestinian refugees, including 87 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*

- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,382 days in a row.*
- *195 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,113 and 964 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,457 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 191 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
