Latest Developments

AGPS documented the death of 3,505 Palestinian refugees in war-torn Syria, 1,141 among whom as a result of shelling.

873 refugees died in ongoing clashes between the regime troops and the opposition outfits while 462 others died under torture in government penitentiaries.



AGPS reports and up-dated statistics on the Palestinian of Syria are available on the group's website, both in English and Arabic.

Meanwhile, Norwegian delegate in Damascus expressed Norway's readiness to help reconstruct the infrastructure of besieged Yarmouk Camp in partnership with UNRWA and the Syrian government after all armed militias retreat from the camp.

The pledges were released during a meeting held on Tuesday at the office of the head of the political department of the Palestine Liberation Organization, Ambassador Anwar Abdul Hadi, in Damascus.



Abdul Hadi briefed the Norwegian delegate on the tragic situation endured by the Palestinian refugee community in beleaguered camps across war-ravaged Syria.



The meeting was held at a time when Yarmouk residents have been on tenterhooks in anticipation of ISIS retreat. ISIS militias grabbed hold of 60% of Yarmouk after they crept into the camp in 2015.

In another development, the Palestinian Charity Commission continues to distribute children's milk to a number of families displaced from Yarmouk Camp in Yalda, Babila, and Beit Sahem.

The move makes part of ongoing endeavors to tone down the crises endured by the displaced Palestinian families in southern Damascus.

At the same time, Jafra Foundation for Relief and Youth Development in southern Damascus continues to distribute food boxes to families stranded in Yarmouk and those displaced from the camp to nearby towns.



Hundreds of Palestinian families fled Yarmouk Camp to such adjacent towns as Yalda, Babila, and Beit Sahem after ISIS grabbed hold of the camp in early April 2015.



Palestinians of Syria: May 31, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,505 Palestinians, including 462 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,603 Palestinian refugees, including 99 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,409 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,144 and 995 days.*

- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,488 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 222 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
