Victims

The AGPS received news about the death of the PLA conscript Mahmoud Hazem Abu Jarbo, who died due to clashes in Tal Al Sewwan area in Damascus Suburb.

The AGPS also received uncertain news about the execution of the Major Khaldoun Al Nader with a number of conscripts few days ago due to his refusal to send support forces to the Syrian Army in its battles, the AGPS was not able to make sure of the news.

In the Yarmouk camp, Ahmed Mohammed Mnawer from the Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees died due to malnutrition and the lack of medical care because of the strict siege that is imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC since more than 600 days. The number of the siege victims of the Palestinians of Syria according to the AGPS was raised to 170 victims till yesterday.

Recent Updates

The Yarmouk camp for Palestinian Refugees in Damascus was exposed yesterday to a number of shells that targeted separate areas of the camp resulted in only material damages, coincided with clashes on more than one front in the camp.

The Regular Army and PFGC groups are still imposing a strict siege on the camp since 600 days. In Aleppo, the residents of Handarat camp are still out of their camp since 675 days after the control of the Syrian Opposition forces over the camp. It is mentioned that the camp is exposed to violent bombing which led to damaging so many buildings.

The suffering of the displaced families is increasing due to the high costs of rent houses and the spread of unemployment amongst its residents. In General, the Displaced Palestinian refugees in Syria are suffering of several economic crises; most prominent high costs of rent houses and the spread of unemployment. The refugees suffer from the high prices of the rent houses in the areas that they were displaced to for example the house rent costs 150 \$ to 350 \$ and this comes in light of the spread of unemployment where most of the refugees lost their jobs due to war.

It is mentioned that Al Zahra Neighborhood, Al Meydan, Jaramana, Qudseyatown, and Khan Danoun camp are from the most areas that receive displaced refugees.

On the other hand, UNRWA declared its intention to distribute some financial aids to the families that are categorized under the item difficult cases in Al Aedin camp at Hama, It is mentioned that Al Aedin camp receives big numbers of displaced families from different camps, Damascus cities, Aleppo, Idlib, Suburb, Hama, Deir Al Zoor, Al Reqqa, Daraa and the Lathekia. It is considered from the relatively calm camps



but its residents are suffering of the strict security cordon that is imposed by the Regular Army on its entrances and exits and from the raid and arrest campaigns once in a while.



On the other hand, the Turkish Embassy in Lebanon stopped issuing entry visas to the Palestinians of Syria refugees in Lebanon without reasons. The visas' stop led to hundreds of Palestinians of Syria refugees to go through dangerous roads to reach the Turkish lands where their entry is considered as illegal because the border crossings ask for visas. It is mentioned that Turkey allows the Syrian Refugees to enter Turkey without Visas.

Numbers and Statistics till 28/2/2015

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- ***The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 602 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 682 days, water was cut for 172 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 169 victims.*
- *80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.*

- ***Al Husayneyya Camp:*** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **504** days respectively.
- ***Al Sbeina Camp:*** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **473** days respectively.
- ***Handarat Camp:*** - Residents have left the camp for **675** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- ***Dara'a Camp:*** - It is now almost **319** days without water and **70%** of its buildings were demolished.
- ***Jermana, AL SaiedaZainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:*** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- ***Khan Al Sheih Camp:*** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
