Victims

The AGPS documentation and monitoring team documented the death of 8 Palestinian refugees from Khan AL Shieh Camp during last May. The victims are:

Ahmed Mgabel and Mohammed Salah Al HAshim, 22 years, died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime, while the young woman Falasteen, her brother Mohammed Saed Fayez Saleh, her mother Khaldeia Fayez Zaher, and their driver Khalid AL Ramli died after their car was targeted by the Syrian security members. The two refugees Tariq Ismael Mohammed and Muhannad Khalid Mohammed died by a Syrian security member who shot them near their house in Jaramana area.

Recent Updates

Syrian security forces released, in the late hours of the day before yesterday, four students from the Yarmouk camp who were arrested at the Beit Sahem Checkpoint, while they came out of the camp to perform their official exams.

The activists stressed that the released students were transfer to temporary accommodation center for students of the Yarmouk refugee camp in Palestine School.

It is noteworthy that 67 students from the Yarmouk camp came out on 30/5 f through the Beit Sahem checkpoint to perform the high school exams for the academic year 2014-2015, where the students headed to Saed Al Aas Centre for girls, and Palestine preparatory school for boys



at Al Amin neighborhood (Alliance) in Damascus in order to reside there during the exam period.

On the other hand, communications and Internet resumed working in the Yarmouk refugee camp after being cut for about "24" continuous hours.

Turning to Damascus suburb, while warplanes targeted the surrounding farms of Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb with at least four explosive barrels, accompanied by artillery shelling that targeted the same areas, which resulted in a state of panic among residents for fear of shelling that would target their homes As in many previous times.

The residents are still suffering especially with regard to the health side, where there is no clinic in the camp, but one belonging to UNRWA, which only provides simple medical services.

The suffering of displaced Palestinian families in Qudsaya area, Damascus suburb, is exacerbating as a result of high prices and widespread of unemployment among them, and also because of the lack of income for most of these families who have been forced to rent houses with high prices, which caused them economic and financial crisis in addition to their blight and the loss of their homes and properties in the Palestinian camps.

In the meantime, the town of Qudsaya experiencing an unstable state due to the deterioration of the security situation between now and then. It was referred that nearly 6000 Palestinian families who were displaced from the Yarmouk refugee camp and other camps live in Qudseia area because of the crisis in their region three years ago.



Lebanon

69 male and female students from the Palestinians of Syria have returned at dawn yesterday to Lebanese territory, after performing their elementary examinations in Syria, where the Cultural Counselor of Palestine Embassy in Beirut, Mr. Maher Msheel received them on the Lebanese-Syrian border.

It should be noted that the main problem faced by Palestinian students from Syria who arrived in Lebanon lies in the inability to complete high school or university, or even elementary, but if they have residencies forcing the refugee students to drop out of school or not performing the official examinations that carried out once a year.

In a different context, Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon, in cooperation with the Social Action Commission of Hamas, distributed in-kind assistance to the displaced Palestinian refugees from Syria to Nahr al-Bared camp in northern Lebanon Aid which about 350 Palestinian



Syrian families were benefited, included summer clothing, shoes, and some requirements of blankets and towels.

Turkey

Palestinians of Syria Committee in Turkey distributed financial aid to 28 Palestinian families in the Turkish city of Urfa, aiming to alleviate their pain and economic suffering.

It was mentioned that thousands of Palestinian refugees have fled Syria to Turkey after their camps was bombed and involved in the ongoing conflict. Unofficial statistics indicate that the number of Palestinian Syrian refugees in Turkey ranges between 3000 - 5000 refugees.

Numbers and Statistics till 31/5/2015

- *80,000 Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.*
- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The number of Palestinian detainees who were documented by the AGPS has reached 869 detainees, and 391 victims were killed due to torture in the Syrian prisons.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 703 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 773 days, water was cut for 263 days*

respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.

- *80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.*
- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 584 days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 565 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 767 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 410 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
