"Two Palestinian Refugees Pronounced Dead in Yarmouk, Death Toll Hits 3,487"

Latest Developments

Two Palestinian refugees—Ali Khaled and Mohamed Mansour—were killed in blockaded Yarmouk Camp, bringing the death toll among the Palestinians of Syria to 3,487.

Khaled, a resident of AlSbeina Camp was fatally gunned down by a sniper on April 29, 2017, somewhere between AlHajar AlAswad and Yarmouk Camp.

At least 302 Palestinians were shot dead by snipers in war-torn Syria.



Mansour, affiliated with Tahrir AlSham, was pronounced dead following bloody clashes between ISIS and Tahrir AlSham in Yarmouk. A number of fighters were also killed and injured on both sides.

Meanwhile, Palestinian journalist Muhannad Mohamed Omar has been enduring a mysterious fate in Syrian government lock-ups for the fifth year running.

Omar was kidnapped by the government troops from the office of AlAlem Channel on April 29, 2012 on account of his affiliations with the opposition outfits.



The journalist was born in Yarmouk in 1985. He is the father of two kids. He taught Arabic literature at AlBaath University in Homs and worked as a journalist at AlQuds International Foundation and AlAlem news channel in Damascus.

In May 15, 2011, he joined the Golan Heights demonstrations and entered the occupied Golan with a group of Palestinian youth.

He wrote several blogs on the situation of the Palestinians of Syria and the human rights violations since the outbreak of the conflict.



AGPS documented the incarceration of 1,188 Palestinians in Syrian government lock-ups, among whom 87 female refugees.

In another development, residents of AlNeirab Camp in the northern Syrian province of Aleppo have launched cries for help over the spread of lethal insects, rodents, and stink, inflicted by the contaminated water used by farmers to irrigate their land lots in the area.



The residents appealed to all concerned bodies, including UNRWA, to urgently step in and take action regarding the poor hygiene and diseases wrought on the camp.

The residents further warned of the spread of cutaneous leishmaniasis, caused by Leishmania tropica, also known as the “Aleppo Evil”, “Aleppo ulcer”, “Aleppo boil”, “Aleppo button” or “habbat halab”. It can produce permanent disfiguring scars on the face, especially of young people. Cutaneous leishmaniasis is mainly found in areas associated with poor waste disposal. Water shortage, poor sanitation and lack of other public services combine to create ripe conditions for transmission of the disease. It is a vector-borne disease transmitted by infected sandflies

In the meantime, the Assembly of Palestinian Workers from Syria vowed, on the occasion of the International Labour Day, to intensify efforts in order to create more employment opportunities, secure loans for small-business entrepreneurs, and establish a network of professional relationships so as to tone down the crisis endured by the Palestinian refugee community in Lebanon.

Palestinians of Syria: April 01, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,487 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,187 Palestinian refugees, including 87 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*

- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,383 days in a row.*
- *195 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,114 and 965 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,458 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 192 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
