"A Palestinian Woman Loses her Fetus after a Car was Targeted in Aleppo"



- Shelling at the Vicinity of Khan Al Shieh Camp amid Deteriorated Humanitarian Crises
- The Syrian Security Arrests a Refugee from Khan Dannon Camp in Damascus Suburb
- Residents of HAndarat Camp in Aleppo are still Suffering

Recent Updates

The Palestinian woman, Hana Harb, from Neirab camp in Aleppo, has lost her fetus after being injured during the bombing that targeted the car she was riding in the city of Aleppo. She was transferred immediately to Al Jamiaa Hospital, where she lost her baby, while she and her sister were saved..



Meanwhile, sporadic shelling targeted Ramouseh road the day before yesterday, and led to at least two injuries among residents.

On the other hand, warplanes targeted the neighboring villages of Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb, while at least (8) explosive barrels targeted Al Derkhbayh town. The Syrian regular army checkpoints are still closing all roads connecting between the camp and the surrounding areas, which led to aggravating humanitarian and health suffering inside the camp due to the severe shortage of medical supplies and medicines even emergency.

It is mentioned that, Khan Al Shieh camp does not receive any assistance or relief convoys from various international bodies as "UNRWA" or local and European relief.



On a different topic, the Syrian security arrested the refugee "Moataz al-Khatib" from Khan Dannun camp in Damascus suburb, where he was arrested by members of Pigo checkpoint and was transferred to unknown area

Khan Dannun camp is controlled by the Syrian army, as the army's checkpoints imposes control at the entrances and exits of the camp, while residents complain of ill-treatment of those checkpoints' members who blackmailing them and confiscating some belongings of food and basic materials.

Palestinian refugees, who fled from the Handarat camp since 1127 consecutive days, are still suffering, as they were forced to displace from their homes after the Syrian armed opposition imposed control over the camp. The residents are facing harsh living conditions, especially after they were asked to vacate the ninth unit in the university city of Aleppo, which exacerbated their misery and suffering.



Meanwhile, Handarat camp and the adjacent areas are still subjected to sporadic shelling and clashes that broke out between now and then



between the Syrian armed opposition groups and the regular army alongside al-Quds Brigade. In addition, the regular army is seeking to impose its control over the camp, which is a strategic point, while the opposition groups seek to advance towards the town of Handarat and the central prison of Aleppo.

On the other hand, the AGPS confirmed that the harsh living conditions of the Palestinian refugees in Syria forced thousands of students to leave school and look for work in order to fend their families who were forced to leave their homes because of the shelling and the siege, which targeted their camps in Syria, which added new burdens on their shoulders.



The AGPS statistics indicate that three Palestinian camps in Syria are still under strict siege, where the regular army forces and the affiliated Palestinian groups continue to impose siege over the Yarmouk camp in Damascus for (1082) days respectively, Sbeina camp in Damascus suburb, which has been fully emptied of its population since (935) days, while the Syrian armed opposition groups prevented residents of



Handarat camp in Aleppo from returning to their homes for (1127) days, according to the report.

Besieging those three camps has forced thousands of Palestinian families to leave their homes and migrate to other homes or housing in schools and shelters.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 1\06\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1082 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1143 days, water was cut for 632 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 936 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1127 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 789 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
