

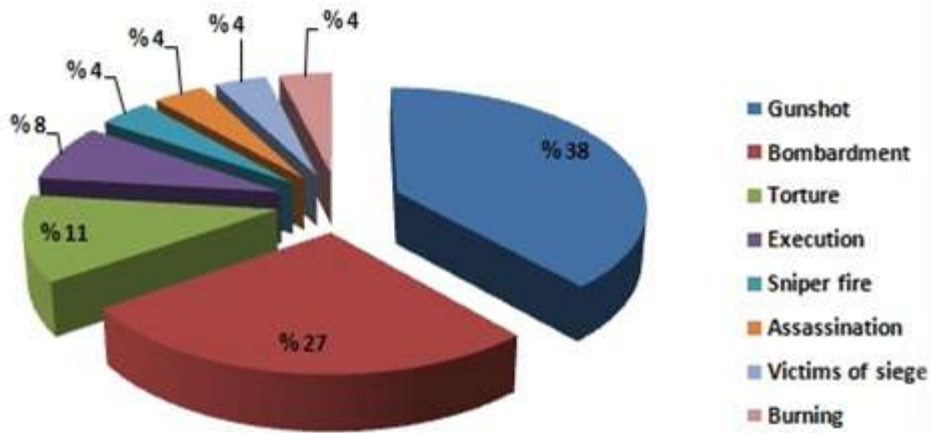

"29 Palestinian Refugees Died During Last October in Syria"

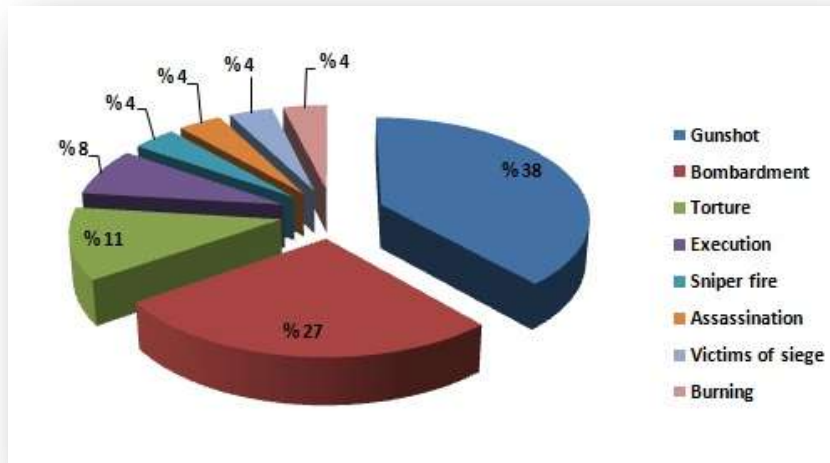

Statistics

The AGPS monitoring and documentation team announced that 29 Palestinian refugees died during last October, including 10 refugees died by gunshot, 3 refugees died due to torture in the Syrian regime's prisons, 7 refugees died as a result of shelling and clashes, 2 refugees were field executed, 1 refugee died because of the siege and the lack of medical care, 1 victim died by a sniper, 1 refugee was burned to death, and one victim was murdered in the Yarmouk refugee camp.



The AGPS pointed out that the Palestinian victims who died during last October dispersed by Syrian cities as follows: 8 refugees in Damascus, 8 refugees in Damascus suburb, one refugee in Quneitra southern Syria, and 9 refugees died in scattered areas.

The number of Palestinian refugees who were killed during the war in Syria amounted to 3057 refugees, according to the AGPS documented statistics.



Recent Updates

A number of mortar shells and shelling targeted the eastern lane of Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb, and resulted in only material damage. Meanwhile, the checkpoints of the regular army are continuing to close all connecting roads between the camp and the center of the capital, Damascus, forcing residents to take the dangerous sub road of (Khan Al Shieh - Zakya) in order to get to Damascus. Zakia-Khan Al Shieh road is frequently targeted with missiles and heavy machine guns.



In the meantime, activists shared photos of expired aid. The activists confirmed that those aids were distributed to the trapped people in the Yarmouk camp in Damascus. Pictures showed some aid provided by international bodies which contain insects and some other were decayed, while some images show dead rats inside one of the food rations. Another picture shows an expired relief materials.

For their part, activists questioned about the reason for severe neglect by the authorities that are responsible of aid distribution, while some of them expressed fear that such actions are intentional in order to tightening on the people trapped inside the Yarmouk camp.



On the other hand, debris and dust began to be removed yesterday morning from the streets of Husseneia camp in Damascus suburb within the project of rehabilitating homes and mosques of the camp.

The project was funded by the Global Relief Foundation in cooperation with the Charity Organization for the Relief of Palestinian people.



According to those in charge of the project, the work will continue for 15 days, where they will re-build mosques, in addition they will install glass windows of most affected homes in the camp.



It is worth mentioning that the regular army checkpoints prevented all people of Husseneia camp to return to their homes for more than two years, before they allow hundreds of them to enter the camp last August.

In southern Syria, people of Daraa camp is suffering from power outages for long periods of up to several days, and complain about the non-availability of fuels and heating materials, in addition to the loss of many varieties of food and the high prices of other materials dramatically.

It is worth mentioning that the frequent shelling and difficult living conditions forced hundreds of Palestinian families to take refuge in neighboring towns.

Civil Work Committees

Al Wafaa Relief Campaign continues, for the sixth consecutive day, to provide relief services to refugees heading toward Austria at the Croatian-Slovenian border. According to those in charge of the convoy, food meals were prepared and distributed, in addition to providing a variety of services such as translation, organizing queues, and families reunion.





It is noteworthy that most refugees fleeing from the war in Syria to Europe, passing from the Croatian -Slovenian border heading towards the Austrian border via train to complete their journey later to the Nordic countries.

Lebanon

Families of Palestinian Syrian students in Lebanon demanding the Palestinian ambassador, the PLO, and the Palestinian factions in Lebanon to move immediately to put pressure on UNRWA and urged them to work to secure teaching staff and textbooks for their children who are in Bir Zeit UNRWA School in Sibliin area of the city of Sidon, southern Lebanon.

Families confirmed in previous message published by the AGPS that their children have not been giving only a few classes after more than two months of the new academic year start.

Noting that the number of teachers who are in a school that contains more than 250 students are only five teachers, noting that the school did not distribute textbooks entirely on students, while they noticed that teachers and books were available to their peers of the Palestinian refugees residing in Lebanon.





It is noteworthy that there are 6000 Palestinian Syrian students studying in UNRWA schools in Lebanon suffer from learning difficulties, overcrowded classrooms, and ignorance of UNRWA to their problems and their educational needs.

Numbers and Statistics till 1/11/2015

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 853 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 923 days, water was cut for 413 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 714 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 915 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 559 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
