"Arbitrary Arrests of Palestinian Syrian Refugees at the Entrance of Ain Elhilwih Camp in Lebanon"

VICTIMS

Three Palestinian Syrian Refugees died during their participation in the Syrian conflict, they are: "Khalil Ismail Fares" from Khan Dannoun Camp in Damascus Suburb, and both of "Tarek Adel Ahmad" a member of the Syrian



Republican Guard, and "Mohammad Ahmad Tayim" who both died during

armed clashes took place in the town of Darayya in Damascus Suburb, both of them were buried in Al-Sayyida Zaynab Camp for Palestinian Refugees in Damascus Suburb.

It is noteworthy to mention that the Syrian Republican Guard is one of the famous squads of Syrian Regime's army forces which usually do not allow Palestinian refugees in, but during the ongoing war, Palestinian refugees were allowed to join newly formed militias. Those militias work under the command of Regime's Army and usually are sent to fight at battlefronts where too many Palestinians died far away from their camps.

RECENT UPDATES

Many activists said that the Lebanese Army has arrested few Palestinian Syrian refugees while crossing the governmental checkpoint at the entrance of Ain El-helwih camp in Sidon Lebanon, that happened under the pretext of not-renewing the residence permits or not-retrieving back the official papers of residence permit from Lebanese General Security.



The Palestinian Syrian refugee "Mohammad Yousuf Mousa" was one of the arrestees despite of his special needs as a man with amputated feet. These incidents have raised the fears of the Palestinian Syrian Refugees and locked them inside the camp, adding more pressure to the hard circumstances which they are suffering from.

The Lebanese government treats the 45 thousand of Palestinian Syrian refugees as tourists not refugees which drops many of its duties towards them, during that, a changing policies is being applied towards refugees.



For instance, to obtain a residence permit, the Palestinian Syrian Refugees have to apply for it and wait for a couple of months, and when they receive the permit they find it almost expired as the government grants only three months each time. In addition to that, Palestinian Syrian refugees are not allowed to get work permission.

Turning to the south of Damascus, news coming from Yarmouk camp that road between Yalda Town and Yarmouk Camp has been closed back and forth, that incident happed after the explosion of explosive device took place yesterday in Al-Orouba Street where one of the Opposition's checkpoints is located, in addition to the death of one of its members by ISIS in Al-Zain neighborhood inside Yarmouk Camp.



Yarmouk Camp is witnessing a real crisis under the control of ISIS and in the light of its demeanor which has been imposed over the besieged hungry people, and the continuation of closure for 883 days by Syrian Regime's army and PFLP-GC militias and the water-cut and the prohibition of displaced people from coming back home.

The night of Monday-Tuesday has witnessed sporadic clashes between Syrian Regime's Army and its militias on the one hand, and ISIS and Al-Nusra on the other hand, causing no significant progress for both parties where ISIS is still controlling 60% of Yarmouk Camp's area, while the Regime is dominating the other 40%.

In relation to the living situation, Yarmouk Camp current inhabitants suffer tragic situations as a result of lack of food and the continuous water and electricity cut for more than 18 months.

It is noteworthy that 18 thousand people were locked inside the Yarmouk Camp, more than half of them were displaced after ISIS broke into the camp last April.

ACTIVITIES OF CIVIL COMMITTEES

"Al-Marhama Campaign" in cooperation with "The Charity Association for the Relief of Palestinian People" distributed 385 veal portions to the needy displaced families in Al-Zahira and Qudsayya and Al-Husayniyya camp.





Also, in Al-Husayniyya Camp in Damascus Suburb, new glasses for windows of damaged houses were set up, and according to those in charge of the project, the beneficiaries of the project are orphan families and families of special needs or those of more than 7 dependents.

It is noteworthy that "World Relief Organization" in cooperation with "The Charity Association" had swept away the rubble from Al-Hosayniyya Camp as part of the rehabilitation of the mosques and homes of the Damascus Suburb Camp. In the same project, Khalil Alrahman Mosque was reopened in 18th of November 2015.

In a related contest, Jafra Foundation continues to distribute drinking water via its water tanks and provides other services including street cleaning and rubble sweeping to the people of Yarmouk who were displaced to Yalda nearby town south of Damascus.

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*

- *More than 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFGC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 883 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 953 days, water cut for 443 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 184 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 744days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 945days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Water cut continues for 589 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Homs and AedeinHamma: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
