"Shelling Targets Dar'a Camp and the Outskirts of Al-Nayrab and Khan Eshieh Camps Results in Injuries"

VICTIMS

The Palestinian-Syrian refugee "Hussam Ayyoub" a conscripted member in Palestine Liberation Army PLO, was killed in clashes took place at Tal-Kurdi area in Damascus Suburb Province, this incident brings the number of PLO victims to 155 refugees, according to the AGPS' statistics.



RECENT UPDATES

Dar'a Camp, south of Syria, was subjected yesterday to artillery shelling and to tanks' shells caused direct and massive destruction of civilians' houses and properties, in addition to the horrifying tension state that prevailed the camp.

The suffering of Dar'a camp's residents is being aggravated on daily basis, as the clashes and shelling almost never stopped since the beginning of the war, this led to the death of dozens of civilians, and to destroying nearly 70% of the camp's buildings. Therefore, the rest of civilians inside the camp, who are estimated at 500 according to



unofficial statistics, encounter lots of challenges in both living and health care aspects, particularly as the running water is still cut for 672 days.



In western Damascus Suburb, reports from Khan Eshieh camp indicated that three civilians were injured following the artillery shelling that hit the camp's outskirts from Al-Kabousiyya nearby hill where the regime's military is positioned. Violent clashes occurred between the regime's and opposition's forces in the same area as well.

To the north of Syria, where the western outskirts of Al-Nayrab camp were hit by three mortar shells which resulted in material damages and caused a tension state amidst civilians of the camp.

It should be noted that the camp's location has gained strategic value in terms of military as it is based near the Al-Nayrab airport. However, the camp is being hit by artillery repetitively causing many deaths among the inhabitants of the camp.

In a different topic, activists from Khan Dannoun Camp accused the popular committees, operated and affiliated to the Assad regime, of committing acts of looting and robbery inside the camp. Many passers



were treated aggressively and rubbed by masked persons, one was identified as member of popular committees, activists mentioned promising to reveal a list of names soon.

It is noteworthy that people of Khan Dannoun Camp, previously, had complained of committees' harassments which they described to AGPS' correspondent as "unethical", such as verbal and physical sexual harassments to girls, and imposing royalties on people under false pretexts of protection.

The AGPS had, months ago, documented a violent brawl occurred between those committees' members and the civilians of the camp following a harassment incident, when many youngsters, according to eyewitnesses, were about to be burned alive by Assad's checkpoint soldiers after defending innocent girl and hitting the offender, major efforts paid by the camp's elders and dignitaries to prevent any consequences and get them released after a while.





RELEASE

The Syrian Security has released three PS refugees after being prisoned for various periods, as follows:

The PS "Saeed Farouk Zaidan" who was arrested for a month, the PS "Wael Khalil Basyouni" who was arrested for two months, and both of them are from Al-Aydeen Camp of Homs City, and the PS "Ali Qasim" from Al-Mozireeb town south of Syria, who was arrested for about four months.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 2 February 2016

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 962 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1024 days, water cut for 511 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 185 victims .*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 818 days respectively.*

- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1011 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 672 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.*
