Latest Developments

The Syrian government executed the Palestinian web developer and cyber activist Bassel Khartabil AlSafadi in 2015, his family has said.

The execution of Bassel Khartabil was carried out days after he was moved to the Adra prison on October 3, 2015.

Bassel was kidnapped by the Syrian intelligence forces on March 15, 2012 and detained for eight months before he was transferred to the Adra prison in Damascus in December 2012.

Basel had been subjected to harsh torture in the Adra lock-up.



The computer engineer is credited with vastly extending online access and knowledge and was a regular contributor to Wikipedia, Mozilla Firefox, and Open Clip Art, among other international encyclopedias, web browsers, and corporations.

Meanwhile, AGPS 15th statistical annual report, issued on Wednesday morning, documented the death of 3,521 Palestinian refugees since the outburst of Syria's warfare, in March 2011, until June 2017.



The statistics-based report provides data on Palestinian victims and detainees. The first chapter covers the number of victims and detainees from March 2011 to June 2017; the second chapter sheds light on the number of Palestinians killed during the first half of 2017; as for the third chapter it was devoted to statistics on the Palestinians of Syria in neighboring countries and Europe.

The report includes fact-based diagrams and charts on the spatio-temporal distribution of victims and detainees, along with their age, gender, and status (militant/ non-militant).



AGPS does not side with any warring party and believes that guilty verdicts should only be delivered by such international bodies as the International Criminal Court, among other legislative parties investigating charges of war crimes and crimes against humanity.

In the meantime, over 1,621 Palestinian refugees, including children, women, and elderly people, have been held in Syrian government jails, where hundreds of Palestinians have also been tortured to death.

235 Palestinian detainees are identified as residents of Khan AlSheih Camp, in Rif Dimashq, while 179 were residents of Yarmouk Camp. 187 Palestinian prisoners had, meanwhile, been taking shelter in ALAydeen Camp and 97 others in Aleppo-based AlNeirab Camp. 82 detainees were residents of Latakia's camp of AlRaml and another 53 were residents of ALAydeen Camp in Hama.

The detainees' fate remains shrouded in mystery. Their families continue to appeal for information. Some of the detainees' relatives remained mum over their fates over retaliation concerns.

Meanwhile, Palestinian activists and journalists from Syria launched a so-called "sard" website in an attempt to write down the cultural memory of the Palestinian community from Syria.





The website is slated to put on display the literary and artistic output of Palestinian refugees from Syria. It also keeps a record of the experiences undergone in war-torn Syria, including the blockade, undernourishment, forcible deportation, and dislodgment.

The website will carry the voice of both professional writers and amateurs from Syria to the world.

Palestinians of Syria: August 02, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,544 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,621 Palestinian refugees, including 102 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,468 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,207 and 1,056 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,550 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 303 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*

- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
