



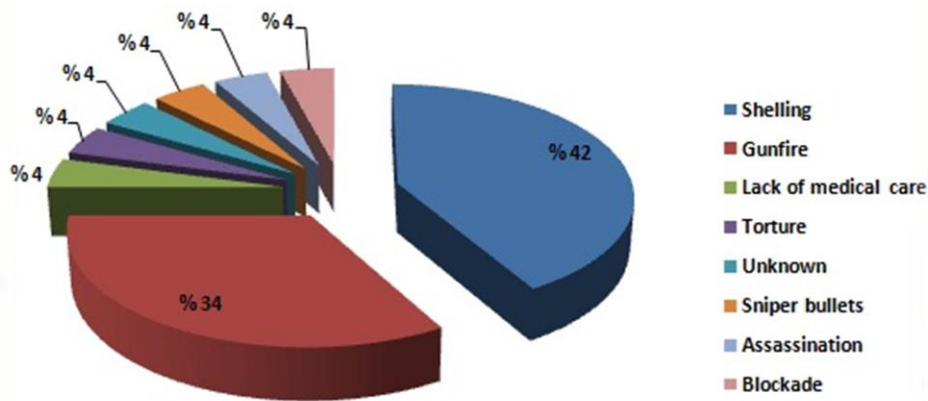

"24 Palestinian Refugees Killed in Syrian Warfare in October 2016"



- **Shelling rocks outer edges of Khan Al-Shih Camp; Alarms sounded over looming humanitarian crisis**
- **Eight Palestinians sheltered in Khan Al-Shih Camp killed in October**
- **Representative of Al-Husseiniya Camp, in Damascus Suburbs, kidnapped by Syrian regime forces**

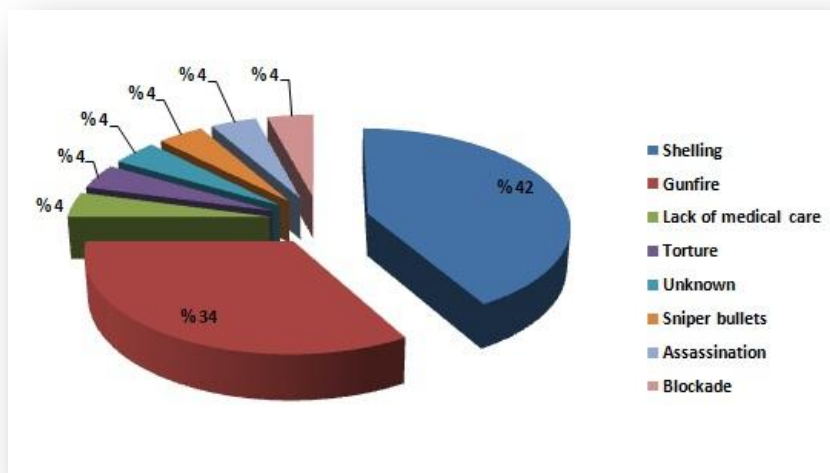
Statistics

The Action Group for Palestinians of Syria (AGPS) documented the death of 24 Palestinian refugees in beleaguered Syria in October 2016.

Ten Palestinians were killed by shelling while eight refugees were shot dead by gunfire. Another refugee was tortured to death in Syrian regime lock-ups. Two Palestinians were, meanwhile, gunned down by snipers in ongoing hostilities. The blockade and lack of medical care took away the life of one refugee. Another Palestinian was killed after he was kidnapped. A refugee died of unknown reasons.

As for the geographical distribution of the casualties, Damascus Suburbs topped the list with 13 victims, followed by four in Aleppo, two in Damascus, two in Deraa, one refugee in Beirut, and two others in unknown areas.

The number of Palestinian refugees killed since the outburst of Syrian warfare has gone up to 3,381, according to AGPS dataset.





Latest Developments

A round of missiles and artillery shells were slammed into the outer edges of Khan Al-Shih Camp and its surrounding ranches on Tuesday, inflicting heavy material damage across the area.

Khan Al-Shih Camp has run out of basic food items and life-saving medicines due to the tight blockade slapped by the Syrian regime troops for over 33 days running.

Local activists warned of an imminent health crisis to rock the camp, sheltering nearly 12,000 civilians, including 3,000 children, due to the acute dearth in bread, flour, children's milk, and medical kit.



Meanwhile, AGPS kept record of the death of eight Palestinians, taking refuge in Khan Al-Shih Camp, during October month.

AGPS identified one of the casualties as Mohamed Ali, killed in a Syrian regime attack on an ambulance evacuating civilians from the camp. On October 6, 2016 Mohamed Hussein, nicknamed Abu Nidhal, was killed after the Syrian and Russian abettors hit Khan Al-Shih's western corners



with a Grad missile. A cluster bomb onslaught on Khan Al-Shih's eastern corners took away the life of one-year-old Israa on the same day.

On October 15, 2016 Palestinian refugee child Meriam Arjawi, a resident of Khan Al-Shih Camp, was killed in a traffic accident near Al-Jalil Camp, in the Lebanese city of Baalbek.

Three Palestinian refugees—Nawfa Mohamed Jarad, her daughter Ibaa Sa'id Al-Nader, and the van driver Kamal Hussein—and a Syrian national were killed on October 18, 2016 on their way out of Khan Al-Shih Camp, hunting for a safer shelter.

One week later, on October 27, the Syrian regime militias assassinated the relief activist Khaled Assaad Al-Khalidi, from the Palestine Charity Commission in Khan Al-Shih, while on his way to Al-Zakia town to fetch bread loafs for the blockaded children, women, and disabled civilians in the camp.

In a related development, the Syrian regime forces kidnapped the spokesperson for Al-Husseiniya Camp, Abdul Hakeem Hussein, also a former member of the Syrian Baath Party.





AGPS quoted sources in the camp as stating that Hussein has gone missing for a couple of weeks after the Syrian regime forces kidnapped him and dragged him to an unknown destination on claims of granting travel documents to an anonymous lady.

Hundreds of Palestinian refugee families have been forced out of the regime-run Al-Husseiniya Camp on account of their affiliations with the anti-regime outfits.

Palestinians of Syria: November 02, 2016 Statistics:

- *There are 15,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Jordan.*
- *42,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are in Lebanon.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt, according to UNRWA figures covering the period from July 2015 backwards.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees reside in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,233 days in a row. Electricity and water supplies have been cut off, respectively, for 1,293 days and 753 days. The number of those killed due to the blockade has hit 190.*
- *Sbiena refugee camp: Refugees could not go back to their homes as a result of the blockade slapped by the Syrian regime forces since 1,086 days running.*

- *Handarat refugee camp: All refugees left the camp since 1,278 days after opposition outfits grabbed hold of the area.*
- *Deraa refugee camp: Water has been cut off for 936 consecutive days while 70% of its buildings have been knocked down.*
- *Homs camp, Hama camp, Jaramana camp, al-Sayda Zeinab camp, Al-Raml camp: A of State of relative calm has been reported in the abovementioned areas. However, economic crises have been on the rise.*
- *Khan al-Shih refugee camp: All access roads out of and into the camp have been closed off by the Syrian regime army for 33 days running.*
