"AGPS: Sweden refusal to grant asylum to Palestinians of Syria coming from the Gulf states, could put their lives at risk"

Latest Developments

AGPS is deeply concerned over the fate of dozens of Palestinian-Syrian refugees after Sweden rebuffed appeals to grant those fleeing Gulf States asylum status.

AGPS kept a close eye on the daily crackdowns Palestinians of Syria have been subjected to in a number of Gulf countries.



Refugees who spend three to six month outside those countries are often systematically bereaved of their right to provisional stays, forcing dozens to wonder down and out in streets.

The situation has gone far worse due to the tough measures imposed by the Turkish, Jordanian, and Egyptian authorities on the Palestinians fleeing war-torn Syria.

AGPS calls on the Swedish Migration Agency to reconsider its asylum knockback so as to preserve the lives of hundreds who have been living under the threat of torture, abduction, and bloodshed.

3,400 were already killed in embattled Syria. Hundreds of others are on the verge of breathing their last on the migration road.



AGPS urges Sweden to resume its positive and humanitarian responses towards Palestinian refugees, as has been the case over the past few decades. Sweden had warmly received thousands of asylum-seekers during the Gulf Wars and the Lebanese and Syrian turmoils.

In a related development, some 2,000 refugees sheltered in Khan Al-Sheih Camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus outskirts reached the northern Syrian city of Idlib, controlled by the opposition outfits.



Several activists, charity delegates, and civilians were forced out of the camp over the past couple of days as a deal struck between the Syrian government forces and the opposition fighters was put into effect.

In another development, the Syria government forces struck the Deraa Camp for Palestinian refugees, in southern Syria, with artillery shells, and the adjacent Al-Sadd Road with a ground-to-ground missile, inflicting heavy material damage on civilian homes.

70% of civilian homes and structures in Deraa have been knocked down by the unabated blitzes.



Meanwhile, alarm bells have been sounded over the tragic situation endured by the Palestinians of Syria in the Lebanese Bekaa Valley with the advent of a freezing winter.



Several refugees taking refuge in the valley risk to die of cold, in an area surrounded by frosty mountains from all corners and slapped by torrential downpours around the clock.

Nearly 850 displaced Palestinian families are housed in Al-Bekaa Valley after they fled the beleaguered Syrian territories.

The number of Palestinians of Syria taking refuge in Lebanon is currently estimated at 33,000.

Palestinians of Syria: December 02, 2016 Statistics:

- *There are 15,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Jordan.*
- *42,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are in Lebanon.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt, according to UNRWA figures covering the period from July 2015 backwards.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*

- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees reside in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,263 days in a row. Electricity and water supplies have been cut off, respectively, for 1,322 days and 783 days. The number of those killed due to the blockade has hit 191.*
- *Sbiena refugee camp: Refugees could not go back to their homes as a result of the blockade slapped by the Syrian regime forces since 1,116 days running.*
- *Handarat refugee camp: All refugees left the camp since 1,308 days after opposition outfits grabbed hold of the area.*
- *Deraa refugee camp: Water has been cut off for 966 consecutive days while 70% of its buildings have been knocked down.*
- *Homs camp, Hama camp, Jaramana camp, al-Sayda Zeinab camp, Al-Raml camp: A of State of relative calm has been reported in the abovementioned areas. However, economic crises have been on the rise.*
- *Khan al-Sheih refugee camp: All access roads out of and into the camp have been closed off by the Syrian regime army for 65 days running.*
