"Shelling Targets Al-Nayrab Camp and Al-Mozireeb Town"

VICTIMS

The Palestinian-Syrian refugee "Samer Mohammad Misad Ibrahim" was killed due to shelling that hit Tareek Al-Sad area in Dar'a, this incident brings the total number of PS victims to 3120 refugees, according to the AGPS' statistics.

RECENT UPDATES

Al-Nayrab Camp, North of Syria, was hit yesterday by one mortar shell caused material damages in houses and properties, in addition to the horrifying tension state that prevailed the camp. This incident was preceded by similar incidents yesterday, particularly on the western outskirts.

It is noteworthy that many of the camp's youngsters participate in pro-regime militias and battles. Knowing that Al-Quds brigade's office is based inside the camp, this contributed in turning the camp into a conflict point between the regime's and oppositions' forces.





In a related topic; the 8,500 refugees town of Al-Muzireeb was hit, yesterday, by artillery shells fired from the nearby regime's military, which according to sources, was preparing to launch an attack to impose its control over the whole area. Meanwhile, the civilians are in a painful state of terror and fears due to the repetitive explosive barrels and shells that caused many deaths and injuries.

Reports confirmed that the Palestinian-Syrian refugee "Mahmoud Mawid" nicknamed as "Abu Abdullah" in Al-Yarmouk camp has disappeared since four days, amidst fears of being kidnapped by unknown group. Mawid's family expressed fear regarding his fate and demanded to be released as he is one of the volunteers of Red Crescent Hospital.



It is important to mention that, Al-Yarmouk Camp is witnessing accelerated breakdown in health care sector, severe shortage in almost all the medical supplies needed there, and the blockade is still going on and accompanied by non-stop targeting of hospitals and medical foundations by regime's forces and ISIS as well.

In a different topic, migration of Palestinian Syrian families continues as the war continues and the living conditions are still deteriorating. Yesterday, a new group of PS families from Al-Aydeen Camp of Homs



City arrived Greece after long and scary sea ride from Turkish Shores via so called "death boats" of the Aegean Sea.



Arrivals assured that the sea condition is very dangerous but "they have no other options", noting that hundreds of fellow refugees are still waiting in Turkey to get a chance to come.

Mr. Sami Mushashi, the UNRW's spokesman raised many questions in the second anniversary of capturing one of the most famous and shocking photographs of Al-Yarmouk Camp catastrophe, circulated by lots of media outlets, shows thousands of civilians, women, children, and the elderly in crowds seeking the UNRWA's food aid while the regime's forces was tightening the siege around the camp.

Mushashi said: "Where are the individuals now, whose faces stare compelling out at us? Are they alive or dead? Did they become part of a lost generation? Were they left behind? The majority are Palestinians yet is the plight of this marginalized community being overlooked, dwarfed by the sheer enormity of the Syrian tragedy?"

The spokesman continued: "We owe it to each and every individual in that photo, to ourselves and to future generations to find answers to these



questions. Without them, the stain that is Yarmouk will forever be on the conscience of humanity".

It is noteworthy that, the UN Secretary General, Ban Ki-moon was later to describe Yarmouk as akin to the lower regions of hell; a refugee camp that had become a death camp. Yarmouk was once home to some 150,000 Palestinians. According to the UNRWA website.



Palestinians of Syria in numbers and Statistics until 3 February 2016

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 963 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1025*

days, water cut for 512 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 185 victims .

- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 819 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1012 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 673 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.*
