Latest Developments

AGPS has documented the death of 3,989 Palestinian refugees from Syria, including women and children, since 2011, as a result of war-related incidents.

Yarmouk Camp topped the list of victims with 1,422 casualties, followed by 263 in Daraa Camp, 202 in Khan Eshieh Camp, in Rif Dimashq, 168 in Aleppo's AlNeirab Camp, and 124 in AlHusainiya Camp.

188 Palestinians also died in unknown locations while hundreds of others were pronounced dead in other refugee camps and communities across war-torn Syria.



AGPS found out that 1,212 refugees were killed under shelling; 1,077 were fatally gunned down, while 604 others were tortured to death in Syrian dungeons; 311 were fatally shot by snipers; 205 died as a result of the blockade and medical neglect: another 142 died in blasts.

The list also includes 92 Palestinian refugees who were extrajudicially executed by pro-government militias and 52 who

drowned at sea. Other causes of death include suffocations and burns.

Scores of Palestinian refugees have also been left wounded, including dozens who have undergone limb amputation or eye loss.

In another development, wildfires broke out on Monday evening in AlBal refugee camp, near Suran city, east of Aleppo's northern region of I'zaz. Material damage was reported.

An AGPS correspondent said the fires broke out in a refugee tent after a gas stove caught fire. Some 30 tents were affected.



Some 35 Palestinian families displaced from Yarmouk Camp and southern Damascus towns and who have sought shelter in AlSadaka refugee camp, north of Syria, continue to struggle for survival in the poverty-stricken area.

Along the same line, residents of AlRaml Camp in Latakia continue to sound distress signals over the dire conditions they have been made to endure in the area owing to the poor sanitation network and infrastructure.

The residents raised concerns over the safety of their children due to the overflowing of sanitary latrines dug across the area.

One of the residents slammed local authorities for reneging on their promises to repair sanitation networks, clear garbage, and remove rodents from the area.

Over recent years, Palestinian refugees taking shelter in AlRaml Camp have been facing abject conditions due to the lack of financial resources, food price leap, high unemployment rates, and steep rental fees.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Omar Yakoob Hejazi, born in 1975, has been secretly locked up in Syrian government prisons for the sixth year running.

Hejazi, a resident of Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, was kidnapped by Syrian government troops on the Lebanese-Syrian borders. No data has yet been revealed as to his fate and location.

According to AGPS data, over 1,760 Palestinian refugees have been held captive in Syria's state-run lock-ups, among them 108 women and girls.
