"Humanitarian Situation Takes Turn for Worse as Violent Clashes Flare Up in Yarmouk"

Latest Developments

Reporting from the blockaded Yarmouk Camp, AGPS news correspondent said violent clashes between ISIS militias and Fatah Al-Sham battalion burst out at the Haifa and Saffuriya crossroads after ISIS lifted iron slabs pitched in the area.

Two ISIS militants were reportedly killed in the fighting while a number of others sustained wounds.



Speaking with AGPS, activists sounded the alarm over the extreme poverty and undernourishment endured by the residents of Fatah Al-Sham-led areas, which have been jointly blockaded by the Syrian government army and ISIS.

Meanwhile, AGPS documented the death of 3,430 Palestinians due to war-related incidents in Syria.

1,131 Palestinians died of shelling while 832 others were killed in unabated clashes between the government forces and the opposition outfits. 458 refugees were, meanwhile, tortured to death in Syrian government jails.

In another development, an exhibition for the Palestinian artist from Syria Ghassan Al-Shehab was held in the Frankfurt Huff Hall in the German city of Mainz, the capital and largest city of the state of Rhineland-Palatinate, from January 28 to February 3.



The event was sponsored by the provincial government and attended by the local minister-president, to whom Artist Al-Shehab offered one of his paintings.

Sometime earlier, Al-Shehab took part in an exhibition held by AGPS during the 14th Palestinians in Europe Conference staged in Malmo.

Several Palestinian academics, graduates, and artists from Syria have strived to make careers of their own overseas after they fled war-torn Syria. According to AGPS data, over 80,000 Palestinians from Syria have reached Europe, mostly onboard the "death boats."



Palestinians of Syria: February 4, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,430 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,153 Palestinian refugees, including 83 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,326 days in a row.*
- *190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,029 and 836 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,373 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 107 days.*
- *Government troops ban residents of Al-Sbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,178 days running.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
