"Two Palestinian Refugees Died Due to Torture in the Prisons of the Syrian Regime"

Victims

The Palestinian refugee, Raed al-Khatib, from Tadmor town in Damascus, died due to torture in the Syrian regime's prisons. He is a football player at the Syrian club of Al Wihda.



The Palestinian young man, Amer Shihabi, from the Yarmouk camp south of Damascus, also died due to torture in the Syrian regime's prisons. The center of documenting the detainees and missing persons reported that a released detainee has witnessed the Shihabi's death in the Syrian security branch in the capital Damascus known as (215).

Thus, the number of Palestinian prisoners, who have died due to torture in the Syrian regime's prisons, and documented by the AGPS, rises to (443) victims.

Recent Updates

The Joint Coordination Body - spokesperson for the Palestinian refugees from Syria, Yemen, Libya, and Gaza Strip and the Follow-up Committee for Refugees from Syria in the Gaza Strip demanded the PLO to take all steps it deems appropriate to find a radical solution regarding the plight of refugees from the Arab countries, and demanded the international institutions concerned with refugees during the wars to bear



responsibility towards them along with relevant national institutions, led by the PLO and the Palestinian Authority.

This came in a message that was directed to "Zakaria al-Agha," executive committee member and head of the Department of Refugee Affairs in the PLO, said that the refugees from the Arab countries have not received the allocated aid since 2015 that was scheduled to be distributed three months ago.



Any mechanism to implement the Cabinet decision calling for the right of refugees to provide jobs and harboring was not discussed yet.

The bodies added that, in light of the difficult conditions experienced by the Gaza Strip, the spread of unemployment, the division, and the failure of NGOs and international organizations to help refugees, claiming that the concerns of international institutions is focused on the refugees in neighboring countries, forgetting that our access to Gaza is the result of the ongoing events in the countries of conflict.

The bodies described the situation of Palestinian refugees displaced into the Gaza Strip as tragic situation, and it became much more than



imagined, as starvation and poverty affected all families without exception. At the end of the message, the bodies called the head of the Department of Refugee Affairs to carry national and moral responsibility.

It is noteworthy that about a thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees are facing very difficult and cruel living conditions after they fled from the war in Syria, where they are suffering from dire economic conditions, in addition to their inability to secure housing and employment, due to the catastrophic situation of the Gaza Strip, which caused by the latest Zionist aggression, in addition to the ongoing blockade for several years.

On the other hand, Jenin Sports Club south of the capital Damascus, carried out "Jenin eighth" Championship for physical strength, where youths from the Yarmouk refugee camp and surrounding areas participated in the middle of an exciting atmosphere. The championship consisted of four weights in the three games (chest, heavy weight, Squat). At the end of tournament, the club management honored the first, second, and third winners of the four weights and presented them certificates, medals, and awards.

The club also implemented football tournament for juniors several days ago under the title "Jenin tournament for football junior players." Many juniors from the Yarmouk camp and adjacent areas participated in the, while the club announced its summer activities under the title "Palestine junior course":

The course includes swimming, gymnastics arts and skills, kickboxing, kung Fu, and football, where there was a wide participation of children



and boys of the Yarmouk refugee camp displaced to neighboring areas amid encouragement from parents and those in charge of activities.



It is worth mentioning that children and young people at the Palestinian refugee camps were subjected to gross violations of arrests carried out by the Syrian security forces against them, which led to the deaths of dozens of victims as a result of starvation, lack of medical care, shelling, and sniping. In addition, the educational process stopped at many Palestinian camps, especially the besieged camps, as well as the ongoing asylum cases from one region to another and instability which put parents generally, and children, especially a tragic psychological situation.

Civil Work Committees

Khairo Umma and Tareeq al Hayat Associations distributed food aid to nearly 600 Palestinian and Syrian families in Gaziantep, Kilis, Urfa, Nezb, and Mrash towns, as well as they distributed 600 food rations in the cities of Adana, Ottoman, Rihaniyya and Antioch



According to those in charge of the Associations, they will distribute aid to the Palestinian and Syrian families in the cities of Krkhan, Iskenderun, and Mersin later.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 4\06\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1085 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1146 days, water was cut for 635 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 939 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 130 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 792 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
