



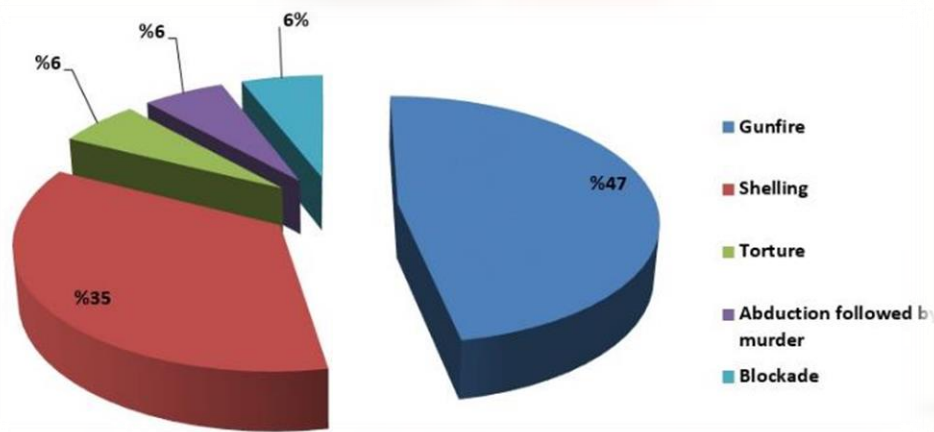

"17 Palestinian Refugees Killed in War-torn Syria in November"



- Shells dropped on Deraa Camp, adjacent Palestinian shelters
- Khan Al-Sheih resident kidnapped by Pro-government troops in renewed violation of truce deal
- Fatah Al-Sham fighter executed for collaboration with ISIS
- Ein Ghazal inhabitants in Yarmouk Camp blockaded by ISIS, government troops
- Palestinians of Syria in Baalbek launch cry for help with advent of frosty winter

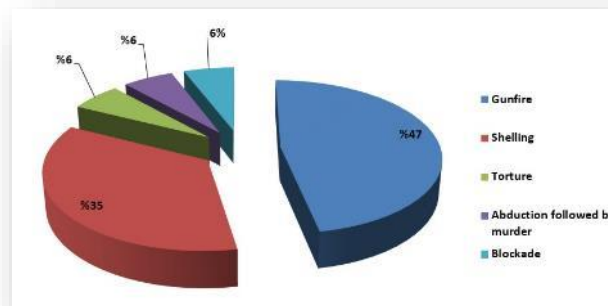


Statistics

AGPS documented the death of 17 Palestinian refugees in November due to war-related incidents. Eight refugees were gunned down while six refugees died in unabated shelling. A Palestinian refugee was tortured to death in Syrian government jails while another breathed his last due to medical neglect and the blockade. One more refugee was kidnapped and killed afterwards.

Rural Damascus topped the list of casualties with 12 refugees, followed by two in Aleppo, one in Damascus, and others in different Syrian provinces.

The death toll of Palestinians killed since the outbreak of the Syrian conflict has gone up as high as 3,402.



Latest Developments

The Deraa Camp for Palestinian refugees, in southern Syria, was struck with a round of shells, at the same time as Deraa Al-Balad and Al-Sadd Road, sheltering Palestinian families, were targeted with heavy blitzes and two explosive cylinders.



Meanwhile, AGPS correspondent said pro-government troops deployed in Khan Al-Sheih Camp kidnapped a couple of days earlier the youngster Hamza Al-Moslih and turned him in to the regime intelligence in Sa'sa' town.



Hamza's abduction comes after the Syrian government forces pledged to cease crackdowns on Khan Al-Sheih residents and to never chase down refugees as part of a ceasefire accord recently struck with the opposition outfits.

In another development, the Fatah Al-Sham Front executed one of its fighters—Mohamed Aboud, nicknamed Abu Ali Khamseen—on charges of espionage and collaboration with ISIS militias in Yarmouk Camp.

Aboud was kidnapped and executed in public in Al-Rija Square after reports of pro-ISIS undercover work reached Fatah Al-Sham battalions.

At the same time, residents of Ein Ghazal quarter in Fatah Al-Sham-led Yarmouk Camp have sounded distress signals over their dire socio-economic conditions due to the tough blockade imposed by the Regular Army and its Palestinian abettors for over three years.

ISIS outfits have also blockaded the main thoroughfares out of and into the camp on account that it is controlled by the anti-ISIS Fatah Al-Sham Front.



Speaking to AGPS correspondent from Yarmouk, a displaced woman said: “ISIS militias prevented me from handing out food boxes to my daughter in Ein Ghazal, where civilians have been grappling with a tragic humanitarian situation due to the acute shortage in food and medicines”.



Since August 5, 2016, ISIS militias grabbed hold of Al-Rija Square along with Ein Al-Ghazal neighborhood and Haifa Street in Yarmouk. ISIS fenced off the main roadblock connecting the area to Fatah Al-Sham-led neighborhoods, blocking civilians’ movement inside and out. ISIS gangs have also prohibited the entry of food and medicines in an attempt to force the Fatah Al-Sham combatants to throw in the towel.

Along the same line, displaced Palestinian-Syrian refugees taking shelter in Al-Jalil Camp in the Lebanese town of Baalbek have been grappling with dire socio-economic conditions, particularly with the advent of a freezing winter season.



AGPS reporter said refugee shelters sustained heavy material damage in Bilal Ibn Rabah Camp due to the torrential downpours that have befallen the Lebanese territories over the past couple of days.

Roof collapses, wall fissures, rainwater floods, and muddy roads have made the area uninhabitable.

The situation has gone far worse due to the apathy maintained by the UNRWA as regards refugees' need of urgent assistance.



Palestinians of Syria: December 04, 2016 Statistics:

- *There are 15,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Jordan.*
- *42,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are in Lebanon.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt, according to UNRWA figures covering the period from July 2015 backwards.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees reside in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*

- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,265 days in a row. Electricity and water supplies have been cut off, respectively, for 1,324 days and 785 days. The number of those killed due to the blockade has hit 191.*
- *Sbiena refugee camp: Refugees could not go back to their homes as a result of the blockade slapped by the Syrian regime forces since 1,118 days running.*
- *Handarat refugee camp: All refugees left the camp since 1,310 days after opposition outfits grabbed hold of the area.*
- *Deraa refugee camp: Water has been cut off for 968 consecutive days while 70% of its buildings have been knocked down.*
- *Homs camp, Hama camp, Jaramana camp, al-Sayda Zeinab camp, Al-Raml camp: A of State of relative calm has been reported in the abovementioned areas. However, economic crises have been on the rise.*
- *Khan al-Sheih refugee camp: All access roads out of and into the camp have been closed off by the Syrian regime army for 67 days running.*
