Victims

Palestinian youth Ahmad Moufeq Ahmad, nicknamed Abu Al-Houda, died on January 27, 2017.



The casualty is a member of the pro-regime Filastin Al-Hurra Movement, which controls Al-Shuhadaa area in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp, in southern Damascus.

The place and circumstances of his death remain however unknown.

Latest Developments

AGPS documented the death of nine Palestinians due to war-related incidents in war-torn Syria, down from 21 in January 2016.

Four Palestinians were killed by gunfire and two died under shelling while two others were fatally gunned down by sniper bullets. Another refugee drowned at sea.

As for the January 2016 death toll, the list included five Palestinians who were tortured to death in Syrian regime lock-ups and three others who died as a result of the blockade and medical neglect. Three refugees died in unabated clashes and shelling while another got frozen to death in a forest on his way to Greece.



The overall death toll among the Palestinians of Syria has hit 3,431.

In another development, violent clashes burst out on Saturday evening between ISIS militias and Fatah Al-Sham Front (formerly known as Jabhat Al-Nusra) as ISIS fighters crept into areas controlled by Fatah Al-Sham in Street 30 and Street 15, to the west of the blockaded Yarmouk shelter.

Sounds of heavy blasts and bullet fire were spotted all the way through the clashes. No casualties or injuries were reported in the fighting.

In a related development, the Syrian Red Crescent has suspended delivery of bread loafs to Yarmouk residents for the fifth day running.

Activists attributed the crisis to the end of the contact struck with the organization, forcing civilians sheltered in Yalda, Babilla, and Beit Sahem to buy bread at 150 Syrian Liras per a single bundle.

Meanwhile, several Palestinian families in Deraa province who have sought shelter in dairy farms and sheep ranches, after their homes have



gone ravaged in the unabated warfare, launched cries for help over their dire living conditions.

Having no place to run to or shelter to hide into, dozens of Palestinian refugees, who have been wondering down and out in streets, have turned to the uninhabitable Syrian-Libyan cattle farm as they hunted for a safer refuge for their traumatized children.

Located in Gileen town, lying some 25 km away from western Deraa, the Syrian-Libyan dairy farm has been rocked by chronic power and water blackouts along with the propagation of lethal infections.

The lack of medical care and the absence of relief assistance by UNRWA and the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO) have made the sanctuary a miserable place to live in.

Those taking refuge in the farm called on the UNRWA and all other concerned bodies to urgently step in and immediately work out the crisis.





Meanwhile, the Beit Atfal Al-Soumoud charity in Lebanon distributed cleaning supplies to a number of Palestinian families from Syria sheltered in Al-Badawi Camp, in the northern Lebanese city of Tripoli.

31,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria in Lebanon have been grappling with a precarious legal status and abject socio-economic conditions.

Palestinians from Syria in Lebanon have also been bereaved of the right to free movement. Many have gone astray due to the restrictions slapped by the Lebanese authorities on the admission of refugees and the renewal of travel documents.

The situation has gone from bad to worse due to the price hike, steep rental fees, and high rates of unemployment.

Palestinians of Syria: February 5, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,431 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,153 Palestinian refugees, including 83 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,327 days in a row.*
- *190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,030 and 837 days.*

- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,374 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 107 days.*
- *Government troops ban residents of Al-Sbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,179 days running.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
