### **RECENT UPDATES**

*On the eve of the Palestinian Child's Day, the AGPS confirms that Palestinian children from Syria are enduring hard living circumstances and are deprived from basic rights such as education, food and security.*

*The AGPS states also that its correspondents network has documented many cases where children were forced to labor in early ages to secure food for their families, while thousands of them were deprived from schooling after displacement and exposure to siege and war acts.*



*The Group's statistics indicate that at least 24 children died out of nutrition and medical care shortage inside the Al-Yarmouk. A total of 196 children were killed across all Syrian cities and camps due to the war, as follows: 107 due to shelling, 14 due to sniper shots, 7 due to gunshots, 21 drowned, 17 due to car bombs, 24 due to siege and medical aid shortage, 1 was burned alive, 1 was suffocated, 1 was run over by car, and 1 was kidnaped and killed.*

*On its turn, the Action group for Palestinians of Syria calls for all the humanitarian foundations, international and human rights organizations,*



*Children care institutions to work on restoration of children rights in Syria and the surrounding countries.*

*In a different topic, Khan Eshieh Camp was bombed by few mortar shells on its eastern and western neighborhoods. The AGPS' correspondent reported that the shelling was launched from the regime's artillery in Al-Kabousiyya hill, and resulted in two women with minor injuries.*



*in a different context, the AGPS' monitoring and documentation team announced that 163 victims from Al-Yarmouk camp were tortured to death in the regime's prisons since the beginning of the war in Syria.*

*This number comes as part of 447 which is the total number of victims from all cities and camps of Syria.*

*In most of the cases; the security forces did not deliver corpses to the families and relatives. Instead, via a phone call, they summon one member of family to come and receive his belongings only.*

*The Action Group for Palestinians of Syria renews its calls for the Syrian regime to reveal the fate of all Palestinian detainees in its prisons.*



*Reconfirms that the atrocities occurring inside the prisons are extremely condemned acts which are against human rights and should be stopped immediately.*

*In a different topic, suffering of the Palestinians who migrated does not end the moment they arrive in Europe as expected. Many obstacles face Palestinians starting from the point of making the decision of migration, continues during the trip weather by land or sea routes, and even after arriving as the long waiting periods (years) to finish the legal procedures is considered another aspect of suffering.*

*One of the prominent problems is the family reunion, which requires waiting for 6 up to 12 months to obtain the interview appointment in the Embassy in one of the surrounding countries, but as for Palestinians, the options are limited almost to Lebanon, since Jordan and Turkey both do not grant entry visas to Palestinians from Syria, while Lebanon does, but under strict rules.*

*This situation pushes many families to risk and cross the Turkish borders illegally, especially if they live in the northern parts of Syria or if they cannot pass the security check on the Syrian-Lebanese borders.*







*The total waiting time to family reunion could be 21 months, during which, more civilians are being subjected to war acts or security persecution across Syria, apart from the family disintegration that threatens the internal links, in addition to the low income inside Syria which may result in children or women labor.*

### ***Palestinians from Syria in numbers and statistics Until 5 April 2016***

- *15,000 Palestinian refugee from Syria in Jordan,*
- *6,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics of July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian refugee from Syria arrived Europe by the end of December 2015.*
- *Al-Yarmouk Camp: still under the siege imposed by Syrian Regime's Army and the PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command for 1025 days. Power cut for 1086 days, water cut for 575 days. The number of victims resulting from the siege is 186.*
- *Al-Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning to their houses for 881 days.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1073 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: water cut continues for 734 days. 70% of its buildings are destroyed.*
