"A 13-Year-Palestinian Child Dies due to Torture in the Prisons of the Syrian Regime"



- A Palestinian Female Died by Sniper at Ramousa Road in Aleppo

Victims

After being detained for about three years in the prisons of the Syrian Regime, in charges of participating in demonstrations, the Syrian security delivered the family of the Palestinian child, Mahmoud Yousef Eid Deyab, his ID papers, and informed them that he was died. The child is the youngest Palestinian victim who died due to



torture in the prisons of the Syrian Regime, as he was arrested when he was only 13 years old. The child is originally from Al Shajara Palestinian village, and he resides at Al Aedein camp in Hamma.

The number of Palestinian victims, who died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian Regime, and who were documented by the AGPS, rises to 444 victims.

Meanwhile, the Palestinian refugee teacher, Khayriea Zuhair Seyam-Um Mohammed Salama, from Nairab camp in Aleppo, died by a sniper shot at Ramouseia road, as the snipers targeted a car was carrying civilians towards Al Ameereia area.

In addition, the young man, Khalid Asaad, from Deraa camp, died in a Jordanian hospital after being injured several days ago while fighting alongside the Syrian armed opposition forces against the Syrian Regime forces.



Recent Updates

The AGPS correspondent reported that a state of confusion and anxious experienced by residents of Nairab camp in Aleppo after rumors about threats by the armed opposition groups of breaking into the camp, especially after the intensification of shelling by Fozfdika artillery tanks of the Regular Army stationed at Nairab Airport near the camp. The shelling targeted regions of the armed groups, while the latter has mobilized after these rumors, noting that the pro-Syrian Regime Alquds brigades and its leadership are stationing at the camp.

Residents of Nairab camp in Aleppo have warned of the practices of the Syrian army and the affiliated groups that would directly involve the camp into the ongoing conflict. The camp has witnessed recently an active movement of the pro-Syrian regime Al Quds brigade groups, while its members have mobilized inside the camp, as they held meetings headed by Mr. Mohammed Al Saed, while the tanks of the Syrian Army are passing by towards the airport.

Meanwhile, snipers targeted a car was carrying civilians at Ramouseia road towards Al Aemeria area and resulted in the death of the Palestinian refugee teacher, Khayreia Zuhair Seyam-Um Mohammed Salama, from Nairab camp in Aleppo, and the injury of the Palestinian student, Asmaa Al Rifi.

The Ramousa road is considered a dangerous road that threatens the lives of civilians, as it has been bombed every now and then with shells and snipers' shot, the thing that hinders the movement of Nairab residents,

including employees, workers, and university students in Aleppo for fear of snipers.



Turning to the south of Syria, where the remaining residents of Deraa camp complain of the inability of their children to resume their education due to the ongoing war in Syria. Some UNRWA schools have been bombed by aviation and artillery, and others were turned into field hospitals by the Syrian opposition members, and some other schools were turned into a prison, which led to a decline in the educational process within the camp. The remaining students were transferred to a house in the camp (Abdullah Yousuf home) to receive educational sessions by teachers contracting with UNRWA.





It is noteworthy that students access to this house through south and east road which is controlled by the opposition.

It is noteworthy that the UNRWA in Daraa camp ran several schools for males and females, such as: Ein Karem, Tabaria, Kfar Kana, and Alsefsaf Schools, while there is no high school; students are forced to head to Deraa town for resuming their high school.

In a different context, the Syrian security released the Palestinian refugee "Moataz al-Khatib," from khan Dannun camp in Damascus suburb, after he was arrested on 1 / June by the members of Bigo checkpoint.

The khan Dannun camp is controlled by the Syrian army, which imposes checkpoints at the entrances and exits of the camp, while residents complain of ill-treatment of these checkpoints' members who blackmailing them and confiscating their belongings of food and basic materials.

- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1086 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1147 days, water was cut for 636 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 940 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 131 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 793 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
