

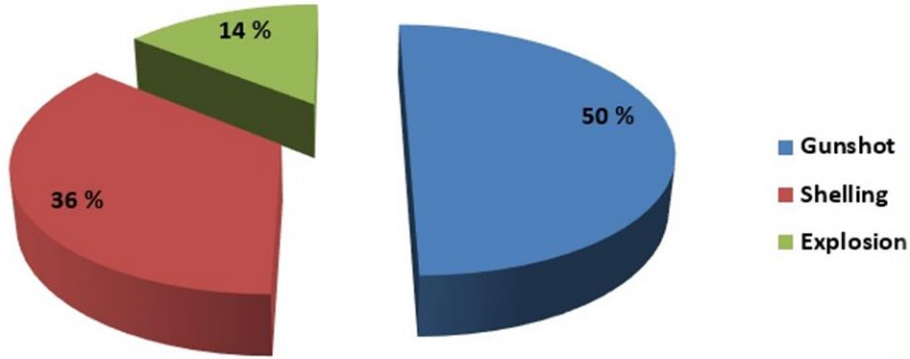

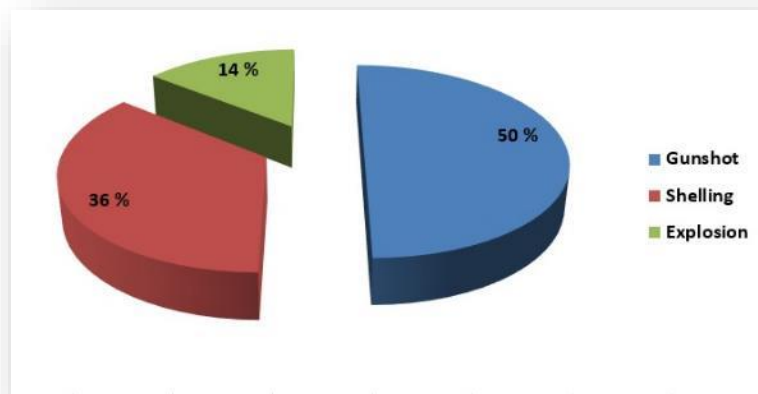

Latest Developments

At least 14 Palestinian refugees were killed in war-ravaged Syria in June 2017, seven among whom were fatally gunned down. Shelling took away the lives of five Palestinians while two others died in blasts.

Daraa suburbs topped the list with 11 casualties. One refugee died in Damascus and another in AlRiqa. Another Palestinian died in an unknown location.



At the same time, 463 Palestinians were tortured to death in Syrian government lock-ups, including women, children, and elderly civilians.

AGPS estimates the real number to be far higher due to the gag orders slapped by the Syrian government on the detainees' names and fates, along with the families' reluctance to report such cases for fear of retaliation.

Meanwhile, ISIS released three civilians taking shelter in Yarmouk Camp after they kidnapped them on Tuesday on charges of carrying tobacco and transferred them to an ISIS stronghold in AlHajar AlAswad.



On July 28, 2016, an abduction sweep launched by ISIS culminated in the abduction of 50 civilians from Yarmouk Camp on allegations of smoking in public places. Those who are caught smoking are subjected to a detention term of one to five days.

Massacres perpetrated by ISIS in Yarmouk claimed the lives of several civilians. ISIS militias have grabbed hold of large parts of the camp since April 1, 2015.

In the meantime, a number of Palestinian young men were kidnapped by the Syrian government forces on Saturday, July 1, at AlHusseiniya checkpoint.

AGPS news correspondent said at least nine Palestinians were kidnapped on the same day as they paid visits to their relatives in AlHusseiniya Camp. One of the arrestees was identified as Mohamed Salem, a resident of AlSbeina Camp.

The charges included drug consumption, which has been denied by the residents and activists.

One of the captives was released sometime later after it turned out that he was a member of the pro-government Palestine Liberation Army.

In another development, the Palestinian student from Syria Zein AlAbidin Khaled Sherif, a resident of Yarmouk Camp, earned the first place at the Industrial Secondary School in Syria (Mechatronics department).

Several Palestinians from Syria earned their secondary school diplomas with honors, challenging the traumatic upshots of the raging warfare.



Palestinians of Syria: July 05, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,524 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,613 Palestinian refugees, including 100 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,442 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,178 and 1,029 days.*

- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,522 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 256 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
