"Artillery Shells and Rockets Target Khan Al Shieh Camp and its Vicinity"



- A State of Tension in Neirab Camp after Intensifying Military Actions in its Vicinity
- Released Palestinians Confirm that they were Arrested for being Relatives of a Wanted Person or Similarity of Names
- Palestinian Syrians and Syrians Sit-in in front of the Sweden Parliament Protesting against the New Immigration Law

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Recent Updates

The AGPS correspondent reported that the regular army targeted houses of the western and eastern lane of Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb with 7 shells per hour. Meanwhile warplanes implemented two raids that targeted the outskirts of the camp and resulted in only material damages.

Russian and Syrian warplanes are repeatedly targeting the camp, especially during the past two weeks, while dozens of residents were killed and injured, in addition to the massive destruction of properties.



It is mentioned that the camp is clear of any militants, which was confirmed by the AGPS correspondent, in addition to the repeated statements of the civic institutions which confirmed that the camp is completely clear of any militants.

In northern Syria, the Palestinian refugees in Neirab camp in Aleppo are suffering of a state of a big concern, especially among children and women, following the intensification of the clashes pace and the sounds of explosions that heard in the camp, in addition to a number of shells that



targeted the camp. Mosques launched calls through loudspeakers calling residents to stay at their homes for fear of being targeted.

The opposition entered the artillery college in Ramouseh area, coincided with closing the road between Aleppo and Nairab camp because of the violent ongoing clashes between the Syrian armed opposition groups on the one hand, and the regular army, the public Committees, and al-Quds Brigade on the other hand.

In the meantime, a number of Palestinian refugees, who were released by Syrian regime, confirmed to the AGPS correspondent, that they were arrested by Syrian security agents because they are from the family of a wanted person for the regime, or instead of him, while others said that they were arrested for the similarity of their names with wanted by the Syrian security services.

According to them, who refused to mention their names fearing the Syrian regime, they have been subjected to all forms of torture, moving between several security branches. Meanwhile, torture signs were clear on a hand of one of them after being tied with electricity wires around his wrists, in addition to the signs of beatings and torture on his body.





After assuring that he is not the wanted person and has no relation with his, he will be released, and provided with a paper of innocence; however, some of them were arrested for the second time for the similarity of names.

Activists confirmed that many Palestinian refugees have been arrested by the Syrian regime or his affiliated groups without reasons; while hundreds of them died due to torture or similarity of names or of being a relative for a wanted person.

The regime's checkpoints became a nightmare that haunts young Palestinians after being displaced from the camp for fear of arrest and being enforced to join the "compulsory military service," in addition to campaigns of arrests carried out by Syrian security services against the Palestinian youth from their homes.

The AGPS documented the names of 1090 Palestinians who are detained in the prisons of the Syrian regime, while the Syrian security is still reticent about their fate.

Hundreds of Palestinian Syrian and Syrian refugees implemented a sit-in in the "Mynttorget" yard in front of the headquarters of the Swedish Parliament for the third day, in protest against the Swedish immigration's application of one of the most stringent laws in the history of Sweden toward immigrants.

The law issued by the Swedish Parliament was recently into force since July 20; the law includes tougher asylum and reunification procedures for refugees in Sweden, where permanent residences was prevented and replaced with temporary accommodations of two categories. The first



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category is for 13 months and the second one is 3 years, in addition to setting strict conditions to refugees who entitled to be reunited with their families, such as work and housing by the resident in Sweden .



Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 5\08\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1144 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1205 days, water was cut for 694 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*



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- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 997 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 189 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 850 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
