Recent Updates

During the last 72 hours, 15 members of PLA died, while three members died yesterday; the victims are:

Amar Aroba, Samer Ali Naji, and Amer Yousef Khalf were killed during the ongoing clashes between the Armed Opposition, Regular Army, and PLO in Damascus suburb

Meanwhile, 7 soldiers died on 2-9; they are:

Lieutenant "Alaa Ali Ajaj", Lieutenant "Mohand Hmed Abdallah", Lieutenant "Mostfa Mohamed Hwari" from Handarat camp, "Mohamed Nasser Falah", "Dyaa Mohamed Ahmed", Mohamed Fathi Bro", and Ahmed Zoher Shabban" were killed on 2-9 during clashes in Tal Swan in Adra district.

On 3-9, three members died; they are:

Majed Horani, and Qassem Nabel Dosoqi, who were killed during clashes in Tal swan, Adra district in Demascus suburb, while Rafat Mohamed Hmeed Alshmaloni was killed during clashes in Ibta in Dera suburb.





On 4-9, the Palestinian refugee Foad Hasan Awad, and Mosa Mhawesh (PLO fighters) were killed during the ongoing clashes between the Regular Army and the Armed Opposition in Tal Swan, Adra district in Damascus suburb.

According to AGPS statistics, 181 of the PLO fighters were killed, except the Liberation fighters' dissidents who joined the Armed Opposition and died in clashes with the Regular Army, or those who were tortured to death in the prisons of the Syrian regime.

Meanwhile, agencies from the besieged Yarmouk Camp reported that ISIS gave the besieged families in areas controlled by "Fateh Sham Front" a time limit until next Tuesday to leave the area before closing it completely, and threatened to close the camp indefinitely.

Since August 5, ISIS imposed a blockade on Rija area and its vicinity, Ain Ghazal and Haifa Streets in the Yarmouk refugee camp after closing the only barrier, which connects "Fateh Sham Front" areas, and does not allow anyone to get in or out of the area. Moreover, ISIS prevents aid and food, except in rare cases, in an attempt to put pressure on the rest of the "Fateh Sham Front" fighters to surrender or to get out of the besieged camp.

Dr. Ryad Idress, the head of Alenqaz medical center, has described the living and health condition in the besieged area in the Yarmouk camp as miserable. He also confirmed that there are many diseases spread in the camp such as, gastroenteritis, enterotyphus, and inflammation of the upper respiratory tract, in addition to dermal diseases, such as itching and skin rash. He also clarified that children under 8 are the high-risk



people, where they suffer from inflammation of the abdomen, and high temperature, which reached 40% in some cases, in addition to general weakness.

Residents of Yarmouk and Dera camps suffer from water outage that forced them to use water wells to secure drinking and domestic water regardless to its validity for human being, where water well became the only available resource for the residents.

Experts confirmed to the AGPS that many of these wells might cause Kidney diseases, where it is not treated, and contains high percentage of sediment.



It is mentioned that the Syrian Regime and its affiliated groups continue imposing siege on the Yarmouk camp for 1175 days respectively, power cut for more than 1236 days, and water cut for 725 days respectively, while Dera camp suffers from water outage for more than 879 days.

In Greece, hundreds of Palestinian Syrians, who are stranded in Greece, complained -in messages to AGPS about Greek government inhuman treatment towards them. The messages confirmed that the Greek



authorities do not provide the Palestinians of Syria the appropriate treatment, and force them to go to private hospitals that need high expenses.

In turn, the Palestinian-Syrian journalist, who is stranded in Greece, "Amal Faour" appealed through a video posted via (Facebook) all international and humanitarian organizations, the International Red Cross, and the Palestinian embassy in Greece to step in and provide emergency medical assistance to her and hundreds of patients.

Faour, who was allowed to enter Athens after being detained in "KAMP" camp for many months, and after the deterioration of her health, added that, "medical negligence is threatening the lives of many refugees, because doctors refused to receive and treat the Palestinian families in Greek hospitals".

Palestinian of Syria in Greece suffer from medical negligence, discrimination, and inhuman treatment.

They also suffer from miserable living conditions, and lack of hygiene and basic services, where they life in temporary houses or tents within the highly and widely spread of insects, reptiles, scorpions and poisonous snakes.

In New York, Applied Media Arts Department at Cornell University, hosts tragedy and black comedy by the Palestinian-Syrian writer "Rama Haider" under the name of "Desert Light", and it will be performed in 22-23-and 24 of September in Squartz Center in Flex Theater for Applied Arts.



The events of the Play take place in the Yarmouk camp for the Palestinian refugee, where two Palestinians-Syrians (in twenties) talk about the best way to escape the camp due to the siege. Eventually, it blows the meaning of love, resistance, and exile with the sudden devastating humor and frankness.

The organizers hope that the American public will see this Palestinian - Syrian figures, as "not only a unique people involved in personal and historical conflicts, but also they represent the low-class people whether men or women all over the world.

Footage of the "Desert Light" was displayed in Theater between Homeland, and exile Forum, new Palestinian voices as a part of Raourient Festival in San Francisco, 2015, the co-production with Theater Without Borders.



The forum was supported, and the "Desert Light" was translated through a donation by Building Bridges Program, Doris Duke Foundation.

It is noteworthy that the Palestinian communities are active in the Diaspora through art exhibitions, conferences, and seminars in attempts



to bring the suffering of the Palestinian refugees, particularly in Syria and the Palestinian refugee camps. In addition to death boats that were used by refugees to reach the countries of asylum, as well as to maintain the identity of the Palestinian refugees from melting in the European communities.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics until 5\09\2016

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till mid -2016*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1175 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1236 days, water was cut for 725 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 1028 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1220 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 879 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
