

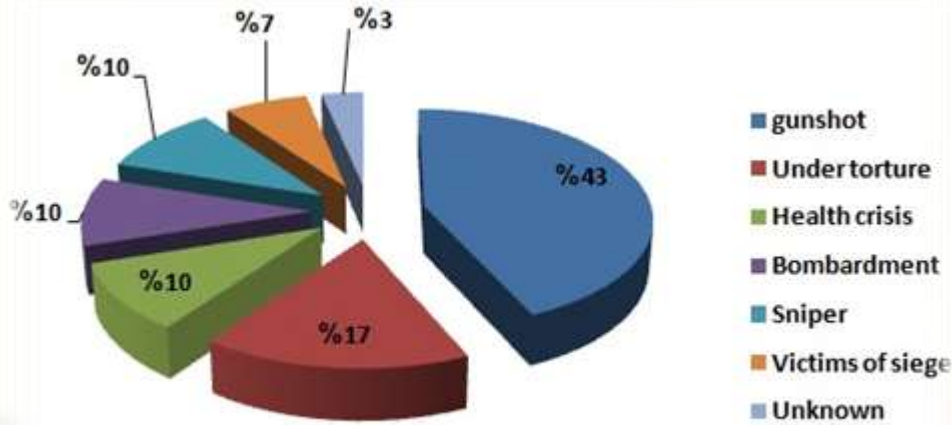

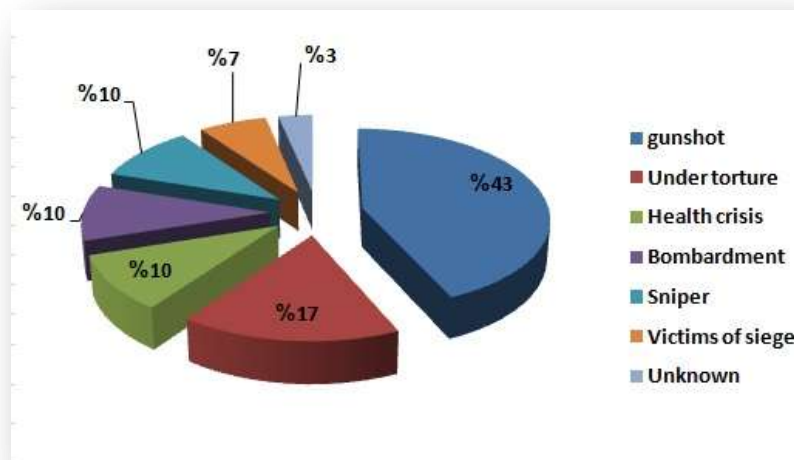
Statistics

The AGPS monitoring and documentation team announced that 30 Palestinian refugees died during last September, including 13 refugees died due to gunshot, 5 refugees died due to torture in the Syrian regime's prisons, while 3 refugees died as a result of shelling and clashes, 4 refugees died due to health crises, 2 refugees died due to siege and lack of medical care, and 3 victims were killed by a sniper.

The AGPS pointed out that the Palestinian victims who died during last September were distributed at the Syrian cities as follows:

5 refugees died in Damascus, 11 refugees died in Damascus suburb, 2 refugees died in Daraa camp, 1 refugee died in Sidon city, 1 refugee died in Swaidaa, 1 refugee died in Idlib, 1 refugee died in Homs city, and 8 refugees died in scattered areas.

The number of Palestinian refugees who died during the war in Syria amounted to 3031 refugees, according to the AGPS documented statistics.





Victims

The Syrian armed opposition group 'Jaish Al- Islam' in the town of Yalda executed the Palestinian Syrian young man, "Ahmed Hossam Haniyeh" 21-year-old from the Yarmouk refugee camp, following the storming of its members to courthouse prison and taken five young men sentenced to "imprisonment" in four months for belonging to an assassinations cell belonging to ISIS, including Haniyeh.



The courthouse in southern Damascus issued a statement discharged from the charge of this crime, and demanded Jaish Al- Islam to immediately deliver all members who did this shameful act towards the courthouse prison to be held accountable according to the Courthouse statement.

This came in retaliation for ISIS against the bombing of a car for "Jaish AL- Islam" near Al Sabereen mosque in Yalda, which led to the killing of four militants from Jaish Al-Islam.



The Palestinian refugee "Alaa Ibrahim Satari," 28-year-old, a resident of Daraa city south of Syria, died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime after being detained for a year and a half, bringing the number of Palestinian refugees who died due to torture in Syria to 420 victims.



Recent Updates

Explosive barrels targeted Al Quds UNRWA School at Al Taqadum area in the Yarmouk camp south of Damascus, causing panic among residents and destruction in the place of the crash.

Meanwhile, a state of security tension prevailed Yarmouk on all fighting points as a result of clashes between ISIS alongside Al-Nusra Front and the regular army alongside the Palestinian factions.

A state of tension between ISIS and groups of the Syrian armed opposition prevail in Yalda area because of the bombings and assassinations carried out by ISIS against members affiliated to the armed groups on the Syrian opposition, which resulted in the execution of five members by Jaish Al-Islam, including Palestinians on charges of belonging to ISIS.

Members of the Syrian opposition checkpoint closed the only road between the camp and Yalda because of that tension.



On the other hand, the management of Jarmaq alternative School in Yarmouk distributed school stationery last Thursday, in addition to an amount of drugs through UNRWA, PRCS, and the National Committee for the Relief of Palestinians in Syria on male and female school students.

The AGPS monitored a number of obstacles faced and negatively affected the educational process within the Yarmouk refugee camp, as it weakened and stopped the educational process.

The most important of these difficulties, the continuation of siege imposed on the Yarmouk, and electricity and water cuts for long periods, prompting people to look for food and drink, and the need to provide a source of living for children, as some children are looking for work, even collecting grass.

The mobility was not limited to students, but also teachers of "Jarmaq" School stopped going to school searching for food for themselves and their children.

The other reason for the stop of education process in the camp is being bombed with rockets, explosive barrels, mortar shells, and sniping, making parents fear to send their children to school.

It was mentioned that the UNRWA's lack of recognition and sponsoring the education process and the results of students inside the camp, had a significant impact on education stoppage in Yarmouk.

In southern Syria, the Palestinian refugee "Hussein Mohamed Mnazi" (23 years) was injured in the leg by shrapnel from the Syrian army shells, during his participation in the conflict in Syria. He is from Al Subaihclan



from Muzeireeb compound in Daraa province, which includes about 8500 Palestinian refugees.



Meanwhile, residents of Al Ramdan camp are living a state of relative calm, yet they suffer from a large living crises similarly as the other Palestinian camps and compounds in Syria; the most important crises is high prices, widespread unemployment, and scarcity of food, medicines, and fuel.

It is worth mentioning that Al Ramdan camp is one of the Palestinian refugee camps in Syria that is located in the south-east of the city of Damascus, a distance of approximately 50 km, 9 km way from the city of Al Dameer.

Detainees

Activists published a petition on the internet calling for the immediate release of the Palestinian Syrian young man "Basil Khartabeil Safadi," in fear of his life to be field trial in the regime's prisons, following the



confirmation of his lawyer wife, "Nora Ghazi" to a media source, that her husband was transferred days before from Adra prison to an unknown destination.

The petition said that Bassel Safadi spent most of the duration of his detention until the date of his transfer to an unknown destination, which is three years and seven months, in Adra prison. Safadi is a blogger and IT technician and a leader in Creative Commons in Syria and activist in projects such as (Mozilla, Firefox, and Wikipedia). All those who knew al Safadi agreed that he stands behind the widespread of the internet and the wide horizons of knowledge access in Syria.

Signatories to the petition said that: "We fear for the safety of Basel. We are greatly concerned about his fate after he became uncertain and we demand the immediate release of our friend".

It is noteworthy that the Syrian security forces continue to arrest more than 1,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees; the AGPS documented 976 detainees, noting that many families of the detainees are reticent about them for fear of reprisals from the regime of their children in prisons.





Numbers and Statistics till 5/10/2015

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 826 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 896 days, water was cut for 386 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 687 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 888 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 532 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
