"The AGPS Issues a Documentary Report Entitled as 'The Lady's Grave Camp' Alsayedra Zainab"

Victims

The 12-year-Palestinian child, Baraa Jumaa, from Handarat camp, died due to the shelling that targeted Al Hamdaneia neighborhood in Aleppo. According to the AGPS statistics, 1077 Palestinian refugees died due to shelling, while the total number of victims is 3245.

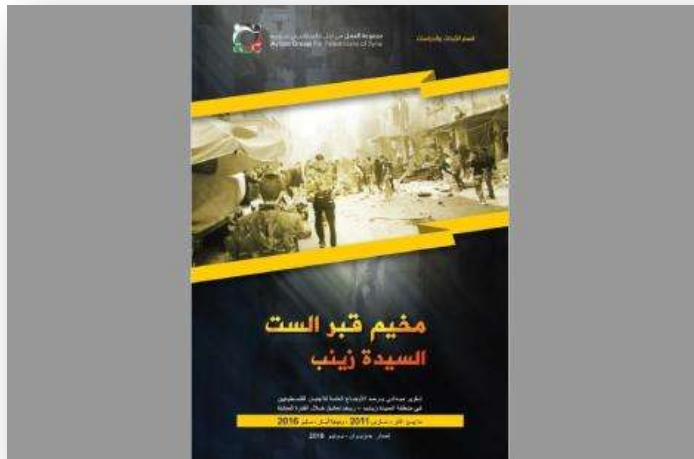
The AGPS issued a documentary report entitled as "The Lady's Grave Camp-Asayeda Zainab." The report monitors the general conditions of the Palestinian refugees at Asayeda Zainab camp and the Palestinian compounds of Hujaira and Thiabeia in Damascus suburb from March 2011 to May 2016. The report addresses the most important events that took place at Asayeda Zainab camp via a clear and objective method for events that were documented by the archive and documentary team of the AGPS. In addition, the report included field eye witnesses by a group of residents who have experienced this stage.

The 34-page-report addresses the conditions of Asayeda Zainab camp in light of the Syrian crisis, including field, health, educational, living, and economic conditions. The report highlights the massacre of Hujaira, which resulted in 250 victims and tens of injuries following a big explosion that targeted a demonstration, in addition to the huge displacement in 18 July 2012.



Moreover, the report mentioned the explosion that occurred in 21 February 2016 at Alsayeda Zainab camp, which resulted in more than 100 victims, including 40 Palestinians, according to the AGPS Documentation department.

The report also addressed the victims, the detainees, and the victims of torture, where the number of victims from Alsayeda Zainab, Hujaira, and Theabeia, since the beginning of the Syrian crisis in March 2011 till the end of May 2016 has reached 118 Palestinian refugees who died inside Alsayeda Zainab area or outside due to the ongoing military actions.



Meanwhile, the AGPS documented 33 Palestinian detainees from Alsayeda Zainab camp from March 2011 till April 2016, in addition to 5 victims who died inside the prisons of the Syrian Regime due to torture.

It is worth mentioning that this report came within a series of field report of the Palestinian camps issued by the AGPS that archives this important phase of the Palestinian refuge. The AGPS provides the researchers with



truth and accurate and documented information regarding the Palestinian camps in light of the Syrian crisis.

Recent Updates

Warplanes and rocket shelling targeted Al Dirkhabeia and Darousha (Alqusor neighborhood) towns near Kahn Al Shieh camp in the western suburb of Damascus with at least two explosive barrels and a number of rockets. Meanwhile, the Syrian regular Army checkpoints are still closing all roads linking the camp and the neighboring areas, which exacerbated humanitarian and health crises, as the camp suffers of a severe lack of medical materials and medications.



In the meantime, local sources in the besieged Yarmouk camp south of Damascus reported that a new mechanism was determined for entry and exit of residents through the gate of Al Qadam area next to the camp on



Saturday, Monday, and Wednesday from 10:00 am till 02:00 pm. Anyone who wants to enter, a relative inside the camp must register before day of the entry at the new local council headquarters in the camp and in the "Abu Iskandar" Street next to Baraem Althilal kindergarten, as well as those who wish to leave shall register a day before in the same place.

Meanwhile, the besieged and displaced residents of the Yarmouk camp are still suffering because of the ongoing fighting, in addition to restrictions imposed by ISIS in the fighting zones with Al Nusra Front. Residents are also suffering due to the siege imposed by the regular army and GC groups for 1086 days respectively, while power cut for more than (1147) days, and water for 636 days respectively. Furthermore, the Syrian regime also prevents the introduction of food and medical supplies, and prevents the return of residents to their homes.

On the other hand, the Syrian regime released the Palestinian refugee "Mohammed Khair Musa Diab" after being detained for about a year and three months. He is from Khan Al Shieh camp in the western suburb of Damascus and lives in a new town near the capital.

It is noteworthy that the Syrian security targets the residents of Khan Al Shieh camp, either in or outside the camp, as they arrest residents at the checkpoints of Sehnaya and Jadedat Artouz at the entrances of the camp. The Syrian security forces are continuously harassing residents especially while leaving or entering the camp. The AGPS documented 109 detainees from the camp; most of them were arrested at the regime's checkpoints, especially Koukab checkpoint.



Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 6\06\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1087 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1148 days, water was cut for 637 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 941 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 132 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 794 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
