Latest Developments

Violent clashes burst out on Wednesday between ISIS and Jaysh AlIslam, affiliated with the Syrian opposition, at the crossroads of Beirut Street, east of Yarmouk Camp. Medium and light weapons, along with homemade grenades, were used in the clashes. No injuries were reported on either side.

ISIS militias reportedly targeted civilian homes in Beirut Street with incendiary bombs. Three apartments were almost burned to a crisp.

A fighter from Jaysh AlIslam was shot and injured by an ISIS sniper in his hand.



Yarmouk Camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine-General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,443 days running.

In another development, Political Bureau Chairman of Hamas, Ismail Haneyya, called for a serious and urgent action as regards the



Palestinians of Syria, vowing that his movement will forever rally around them.

In a historical speech broadcast from the blockaded Gaza Strip on Wednesday, Haneyya sounded the alarm over the tragedy of the Palestinians of Syria, who have been subjected to displacement, enforced deportation, and violation of their basic rights.

Haneyya stressed Hamas's commitment to work out the crises endured by the Palestinians sheltered in refugee camps in Lebanon, Syria and Jordan, among other destinations.

Haneyya appealed to the UN to take up its duty as regards the Palestinian refugees until they return to their motherland.

In the meantime, Palestinian-Syrian families sheltered in the Lebanese camp of Ein AlHilweh, in Sidon, have launched cries for help over the life-threatening security mayhem rocking the shelter.





Severe socio-economic crises have been wrought by the abrupt breakdowns of order in Ein AlHilweh. Education and health institutions in the camp further shut down their doors.

According to statistics-based studies conducted by relief institutions in Ein AlHilweh, the number of displaced Palestinian families from Syria taking cover in the camp has remarkably shrunk back due to the deteriorating security situation.

Meanwhile, UNRWA distributed allowances covering rental fees for three months to 178 Palestinian families from Syria in the blockaded Gaza Strip.

UNRWA staff member Moen Maqat said UNRWA will provide cash aids to 220 families whose homes were destroyed in the 2014 Israeli offensive on Gaza thanks to the Saudi Development Fund.

Palestinian refugees from Syria in the besieged Gaza Strip appealed to UNRWA to provide them with much-needed financial allowances and to work on alleviating the crises endured by several families who have been displaced from their homes due to the soaring rental fees.





1,000 Palestinians from Syria returned to Gaza since the outburst of the Syrian warfare. According to the refugees follow-up committee, 178 Palestinian families from Syria are living in Gaza, down from 360 in 2013.

Civil Action Committees

The Palestine Charity Commission, in partnership with the Palestinian Red Crescent, launched the Sixth Medical Week to the people of Yarmouk in Yalda town, south of Damascus.

Medicines and children's milk are set to be distributed as of next week. The campaign will also provide free medical checks to registered patients.

The move makes part of underway endeavors to assuage the crises endured by civilians south of Syria, where life has been marred by the swift propagation of lethal infections and the absence of relief assistance.

Hundreds of Palestinian families fled Yarmouk after ISIS grabbed hold of the camp in April 2015.

Palestinians of Syria: July 06, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,524 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- 1,615 Palestinian refugees, including 101 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
