***"382 Palestinian Female Died during War in Syria, and at least 34 Palestinian Female Detained in the Syrian Prisons"***

### *Statistics*

*The AGPS documented 382 Palestinian female victims since the beginning of confrontations in Syria, which is equivalent to about 14% of the total victims who were killed during March 2011 until 6th of May 2015.*

*The group revealed that 34 refugee died due to torture in Syrian prisons, 199 because of bombing, 59 as a result of siege and lack of medical care in the Yarmouk refugee camp, 25 women died by a sniper, 19 due to explosions, 15 died by gunshot, 13 were drowned, 5 were field executed, and 13 died due to other reasons (slaughtered, murder, suicide, burning, suffocation, health crises, and by the Zionist Israeli occupation fire).*

*Meanwhile, the AGPS documentation team confirmed that the number of Palestinian detainees in the Syrian regime's prisons since the beginning of the war in Syria until the moment of preparing this report has reached (34) Palestinian refugees. The AGPS said: "Some of the detainees are female University students and activists". However, the statistics indicate that the numbers of arrested women, by the two parties of conflict, is greater than that, but it is secrecy for special reasons related to those cases.*

*It was mentioned that the Palestinian women in Syria had been arrested, kidnapping died, and disabled as a result of the ongoing conflict in Syria since the outbreak of fighting there in March 2011 between the parties of the Syrian crisis.*



### ***Recent Updates***

*Syrian warplanes targeted Al Muzareib town in Deraa province, south of Syria, which is inhabited with about 8,500 Palestinian refugees. The explosive barrels resulted in a state of fear and panic among the residents who live a state of tension and instability due to the continued targeting with explosives barrels and car bombs that killed many of them.*

*The Palestinian refugees and more than 139 refugee families from Deraa camp in Muzeireeb town are suffering of difficult living situations. They also complain about the lack of bread, according to testimony of one of the residents, that searching for a loaf of bread has become an obsession haunts everyone, "head of the family became obsessed with thinking in how to secure a loaf of bread for his family".*

*In the south of the Syrian capital Damascus, shelling was renewed at Yarmouk, coincided with the outbreak of sporadic clashes on the number of axes.*

*Meanwhile, residents carried out a sit-in demanding the Palestinian leadership to take them out and bring them back to their homeland Palestine, where protesters stressed that they do not want to stay in Syria or travel to European countries, but they want to return to the West Bank and Gaza. Protestors held banners "We Want a Return to Palestine" "This is our last goal, history will have no mercy".*

*In a related context, the PLO delegation discussed the mechanism softening food aid and medicines to the Yarmouk refugee camp, and providing safe shelters for refugees who have fled from the camp, during his meeting with Minister of Social Affairs "Kinda Al Shammat" in the ministry's headquarters in Damascus.*

*The AGPS correspondent reported that the Syrian Security Detachment in Homs carried out surveys and census operations of all the inhabitants of Al Aedein camp since Saturday 2015/5/1. However, it was observed complete absence of any member of the Palestinian factions, or Refugees Foundation Department, or UNRWA.*

*Our correspondent said that the census operations included the entire population of the camp, either from the camp or displaced and tenants in the camp. He also pointed out that the security agents demanded homeowners to write rent contracts to relatives or displaced people who receive them in their homes, while the underlying reasons behind the survey process or objective of the registration of individuals, and collect information on residents of the camp in detail are still unknown.*

### ***Detainees***

*The security services in the city of Homs are still carrying out campaign of arrests against the residents of Al Aedein camp, where the Syrian security recently arrested three youth people; they are: the relief volunteer "Yusuf Mohamed Bassiouni," in his forties, where he was arrested earlier this month. The Syrian security forces also arrested on 28/04/2015, the refugee "Abed Ghassan Aliwa," in his thirties. The law student, "Mohammed Musaab Jamal Al Mawed," was also arrested at the beginning of the previous month, 04/02/2015.*

*It is noteworthy that the AGPS has documented the names of 141 detainees in Syrian prisons from Al Aedein camp and their fate is still unknown.*



### **Release**

*Syrian security forces released four Palestinian refugees; they are: the young man, "Mohammed Mousa Mohammed Shatara," and "Khaldoun Mohammed Musa Shatara", from Al Aedein camp in Homs. They are in their thirties, originally from Tarshiha village in Palestine.*

*The released others are from Khan Sheikh camp; they are: the Palestinian refugee "Ali Al Taweel," who was arrested several days ago at AL Masnaa checkpoint while returning from Lebanon to Syria, and "Jameela Wahaibi", who was arrested by Sasa branch.*

### **Morocco**

*50 Palestinian Syrian refugees are stuck in one of the border areas near the mandate of Melilla in northern Morocco since last Thursday. They launched a distress call while trying illegal immigration to Spain to escape from the hell of the war in Syria, to all international bodies and human rights organizations to intervene in order to end the tragedy, and to communicate with the Moroccan government to allow them to leave the territory to European countries.*

*A number of human rights activists had been transferred an audio tape across social networking for a stuck lady in the area off "Spain Gate" in Morocco. A Palestinian displaced from the Yarmouk refugee camp, describing the extent of the suffering she experienced with Palestinian refugees as they travel; she described "Road Trip "as a" way of death". she clarified that the trip was going from an area called "Mughaneia" in*



*Morocco, and the topography of the place was very rugged, which is mountains and valleys used by immigrants walk for several hours, all the way to the state of Melilla maritime border.*

*About the treatment of the smugglers to them and how to take them from one place to another, said the Palestinian refugee: "The smugglers transferred them by cars at specific points, and from one place to another; from one city to another. We walked on foot over roads, mountains, and valleys over thorns, plants, and stones. She pointed out that smugglers prevented them from talking, using phones, and even cigarette smoking, for fear that border guards reveals our moves and arrest us, confirming that they survived the border guards several times.*

*She added that the smugglers told all refugees after their arrival in the coastal area of Melilla that "Spain crossing" that the border opens on Monday, and they can wait and rent a room in a hotel in the region, pending for opening the crossing. She resumed, " we went on Monday to the border crossing to cross to the other side, However, we were surprised by the presence of the police directly to beat us with sticks all without exception (children, pregnant women, elders), and without taking into account a minimum of humanitarian limits.*

*The Palestinian female refugee stressed during the interview that they are today at the mercy of the border guards and smugglers, and when trying to cross to the other side are being insulted, beaten and humiliated, describing the border crossing as worse than Rafah crossing, and the treatment is worse than the of the "Israel" occupation treatment for the Palestinians at checkpoints and border crossings.*



*Finally, the lady appealed all concerned, first and foremost the Palestinian Authority embassy in Rabat and human rights organizations to immediately intervene to end their tragedy that has been lasted for a week, by providing the price of daily food for them to say the least, and to open the way towards a decent life.*

### **Turkey**

*The Turkish Coast Guard rescued more than 600 people who were trying to cross the Aegean Sea in inflatable boats over the past five days, including women and children who fled the ongoing war in Syria. The governor of the coastal Izmir province Office of Reuerz said that more than 400 out of 636 migrants who were rescued are from Syria.*

*It is noteworthy that Turkey is one of the most important transit points, especially the Palestinian and Syrian refugees fleeing from the furnace war in Syria, while immigrants go through land and sea ways in spite of the seriousness the roads.*







### **Sweden**

*"Letters from Yarmouk" film is scheduled to be displayed in the festivals of Stockholm and Uppsala in Sweden, which is organized by Malmo Arab Film Festival in the presence of a group of Arab filmmakers.*

*The movie "Letters from Yarmouk," directed by Rashid Masharawi, consists of messages sent from the devastated Yarmouk refugee camp by Skype program, and has been transferred into a celluloid as a documentary movie that mimics life. The movie highlights the humanitarian catastrophe that has befallen the Palestinian refugees in Yarmouk camp.*

### **Numbers and Statistics till 6/5/2015**

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- ***The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 678 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 748 days, water was cut for 238 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 176 victims.*
- *80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.*

- **Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **569** days respectively.
- **Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **540** days respectively.
- **Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for **742** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- **Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost **385** days without water and **70%** of its buildings were demolished.
- **Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- **Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
