Latest Developments

Palestinian refugee students have obtained the highest scores as part of their high school exams across Syria.

The list includes Palestinian girl Hana Wafik Mohamed, born and raised in AlHusainiya Camp, who garnered the highest score in AlQuneitra province.

Hundreds of displaced Palestinian refugees in/from Syria have achieved success stories, despite the traumatic upshots wrought by the daily scenes of bloodshed and destruction across the embattled Syrian territories.

This includes scores of refugee students who have obtained the highest scores at their academic institutions; hundreds of refugee sportsmen/sportswomen who snatched the first places in regional and international competitions; dozens of artists who received renowned literary awards for their products and performances; and several housewives who turned trauma into a space of creativity.

In another development, the Arab daily in Britain said Western countries, including Sweden, Denmark, and Germany, have been duped by reports about stability and calm in Damascus.

The newspaper said such standpoints cite the sporadic ceasefire and dwindling military operations along with the regime's takeover of Rif Dimashq as their main argument.

By the same token, the aforementioned countries rejected dozens of asylum applications by asylum seekers fleeing from Damascus and its countryside, including Palestinians, claiming that military actions have ended and calm has been restored in the country.

The Danish Immigration Department also issued deportation decisions against hundreds of residents.

Meanwhile, the World Health Organization (WHO) said humanitarian needs in Syria are at their highest since the start of the conflict.

WHO said it has been working with the different warring parties to provide life-saving support in Syria.



The organization said 11 years of conflict have damaged the coping mechanism of Syria's healthcare system and destroyed healthcare facilities.

Today, the humanitarian situation in north-west Syria is at its worst since the start of the conflict in 2011. 4.4 million people, mostly women and children, are trapped in a war-zone along the border with Türkiye.

In the meantime, the Water Directorate repaired the main water line in AlAyedeen Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Hums, following complaints filed by the residents.

Water has been cut off in the camp since last Tuesday.

Palestinians taking shelter in AlAyedeen Camp in Hums have been facing a deteriorating humanitarian situation as a result of the price leap, sharp shortage in fuel supplies, the frequent power blackouts, and absence of humanitarian assistance. High rates of unemployment and the security turmoil rocking the region have made the situation far more alarming.
