## Latest Developments:

AGPS's correspondent in south Damascus confirmed that the Syrian regime forces targeted Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees using heavy artillery shelling, the day before yesterday. Several shells fell on Al-Karaeen sector in Palestine Street and Al-Tadamon neighborhood, adjacent to the camp, which caused destruction to the residents' houses.

Yarmouk camp is under a double siege by the Syrian regime forces and the Palestinian factions affiliated to it since 1543 days, as well as ISIS that took control of the camp in April 2015.

In another context, the Palestinian families living adjacent to the southern area of Damascus's residents are facing great suffering, anxiety and renewed fear with the approach of winter, due to the inability of many households to secure their heating costs because of high unemployment rates and no financial resources.

An activist said that the families' need for firewood is no less than their need for food cartons, which hundreds of refugees live on today. However, the weight of suffering is increasing on the shoulders of the refugees, due to the rise of prices in general and especially the prices of their necessities. The price of one kilo of firewood in the towns of Yelda, Babilla and Beit Sahm, inhabited by thousands of displaced Palestinian refugees from Yarmouk camp, has reached 100 Syrian pounds. Each family requires a minimum of 20 kilos on a daily basis, thus almost 60 thousand pounds per month for heating only, which is equivalent to 120 thousand dollars.

For their role, the activists and residents of Yarmouk camp and the southern area called for the introduction of fuel from oil and gas for heating and cooking, to relieve their suffering in winter.

The Syrian regime forces and its affiliated factions continue to besiege Yarmouk camp, preventing gas and aid from entering and banning families from returning to their homes. ISIS is still under control of large areas in the camp, imposing its agendas on the besieged people.





In another topic, pages close to the reconciliation committee in Sabinah town in the suburb of Damascus, published a list of about 90 names, including Palestinian refugees, of those who have permission to enter the town using entry cards which will be given to them today.

The Syrian security had banned non-card holders from entering Sabinah town and its camp.

These cards were obtained through the reconciliation committee and the Syrian security committee in the area. According to the reconciliation committee 400 families received their cards and were allowed to enter the town and return to their homes.

In another context, AGPS has been receiving messages from the Palestinian refugees who fled from Syrian to Egypt, warning of bullying actions targeting the displaced from Syria for the sake of extorting them and stealing their money.

A refugee explained that a Kia Cerato civilian car with tinted glass stopped him and one of its passengers asked him about his nationality. After learning that he was displaced from Syria, the passenger asked him for his passport. The refugee refused to show him his passport unless the passenger revealed his ID card to him. He gave him his identity card in which his name was Muhammed E. F. issued by the Department of Investigation Cairo.

The refugee handed him his passport where his residence permit seemed to have expired. The passengers demanded him to get in to the car and turned off his mobile phone. The refugee added: “I thought they were taking me to Gesr Al-Suez, however they took the Suez road which I know does not have any police departments or security centers.”

“Before the Future City junction they asked me to take out all of my money and when I refused, one of them took out his gun while the other pointed a knife at me and they cursed me. I gave them all I had and they threw the passport in the middle of the main street. I took the passport and dozens of cars were going to run me over. I returned home, broken, and in debt to a taxi.

Dozens of cases of robbery and theft have been repeated against Palestinian-Syrian refugees, as well as attempts to attack and harass women in Egypt.

Palestinian- Syrians in Egypt are also complaining from the weakness of their official representation. A number of refugees have told AGPS about the dereliction of the Palestinian embassy in Cairo, the Palestinian Liberation Organization and the international organizations in solving their living and legal issues.

### **Palestinians of Syria: October 7, 2017 Statistics:**

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3595, including 462 women
- 1639 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,543 days in a row
- 199 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1280 days, and 1120 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,616 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 367 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
