"One Victim and at Least 7 Injuries due to the Artillery and Explosive Barrels at Khan Al Shieh Camp and its Vicinity"

Recent Updates

Heavy artillery shelling targeted the houses of Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb on Tuesday night, and resulted in at least one victim and a number of injuries. A child, who was displaced from the neighboring towns died, in addition to at least 7 injuries, including women.

The AGPS correspondent reported that more than 7 civilians were injured by the artillery shells of the regime forces stationed at Talet Al Kabouseia area. The shelling targeted Alhuda mosque while prayers were leaving the mosque, while a resident was injured after a shell landed at one of the eastern lanes of the camp.



Meanwhile, warplanes targeted the adjacent villages and the outskirts of Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb with at least 12 explosive barrels, coincided with shelling by rockets launcher towards the regiment 137 of the regime forces, which led to a state of panic among residents, especially children.



Furthermore, residents are still suffering of living crises after the regular army closed all roads linking the camp with the center of the capital Damascus, which led to severe shortage of medical and food supplies.

The warplanes also implemented a number of raids that targeted Handarat camp in Aleppo and resulted in huge material damages at houses, while clashes and sniping broke out between the armed opposition groups and the pro-Syrian regime Alquds brigades who is trying to break into the camp with little progress.

It is noted that all residents of Handarat camp have fled following violent fighting that broke out between the regular army and the Syrian armed opposition groups, which ended with the opposition groups control over the camp 1133 days ago.



The Syrian armed opposition groups prevented the residents of returning back to the camp since then, while the camp was frequently targeted by explosive barrels along this period, which destroyed almost 80% of the camp's buildings. ISIS released a woman who was arrested yesterday after she cursed some members of ISIS after they prevented her to reach her house at the YAtmouk camp. Eye witnesses reported that ISIS



members opened fire against 3 women yesterday and they arrested one of them and detained her at Al Hajar Al Aswad area under the pretext of her husband being a fighter at Al Nusra.

They also added that ISIS has arrested the young man, Hussein Salfiti, with no charges and he was led to unknown area, while activists and eye witnesses confirm that there are detainees for ISIS and they are still unaccounted for.

Some activists believe that this is a new chapter of tightening and escalation against the besieged civilians in the Yarmouk camp, and also against Nusra members who are besieged in some areas of the camp. Clashes are still ongoing between the two parties for about 2 months with no progress for any of them.

Residents of Yarmouk are still suffering due to the siege imposed by the regular army and the GC groups for 1088 days respectively, power cut for more than 1149 days, and water cut for 638 consecutive days. The Syrian regime also prevents the entry of food and medical supplies, as well as the return of residents to their houses, in addition to the ongoing fighting inside the camp. Moreover, ISIS is still imposing restrictions against the besieged residents of Yarmouk in the clashes areas with Nusra.

Civil Work Committees

The charity Committee distributed Iftar meals, within its campaign 'Kasrat Khoboz', to the Palestinian refugees in several areas of the



capital Damascus and its suburb. The Committee distributed 800 Iftar meals for people who reside at Al Zahira Al Qadima, Al Qadam, Al Dahadeel, and Nahr Al Sayeda Aisha areas. The Committee also distributed 800 Iftar meals for the Palestinian refugees who fled from Yarmouk and other camps and reside at Tahir Al jazaeri School which turned into a shelter. The Committee is preparing food baskets for Ramadan to be distributed later.

It is worth mentioning that thousands of Palestinian refugees have fled from their camps, especially Yarmouk, after the regular army targeted them. Most of them are living in rented houses or schools that turned into shelters.

- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1089 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1150 days, water was cut for 639 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 943 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 134 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 796 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
