Latest Developments

Onslaughts on AlSadd Road, in Daraa, claimed the lives of two people and left others wounded.

Reporting from southern Damascus, AGPS news correspondent said the Syrian government forces struck AlSadd neighborhood, housing Palestinian families, and Daraa Camp for Palestinian refugees with dozens of ground-to-ground missiles and barrel bombs.



Over the past couple of days, the camp sustained heavy material damage due to the government offensives rocking the area. At the same time, clashes have been ongoing between the opposition outfits and the government forces as the latter continue to strive to break into the camp.

Meanwhile, civilians stranded in Daraa Camp called on all the warring actors, UNRWA, and the Palestine Liberation Organization to work on granting them safe shelters.

The residents further pushed for securing safe passageways before women, children, and elderly civilians and for urgently transferring the wounded and sick people out of the camp.



80% of Daraa buildings have been reduced to rubble in the rampant warfare, forcing several families to seek shelter elsewhere. Those who have remained in the camp have been subjected to abject conditions due to the tough cordon enforced by the government army. Civilians continue to launch cries for help over the acute shortage in much-needed foodstuff and the frequent power, water, and telecommunication cuts-off.

In another development, a few days earlier, the Turkish gendarmerie in the northwestern Turkish province of Edirne arrested 124 migrants as they tried to cross the Turkish borders on way to Greece.

Turkish reports identified the migrants and asylum seekers as Syrians, Pakistanis, Algerians, Georgians, Moroccans, and Palestinians.

The Turkish forces further nabbed 46 illegal migrants who were planning to reach Europe through the Aegean Sea.



Turkish security sources said the gendarmerie troops broke into a number of homes in Suleiman Pasha in Tekirdag city, northwest of Turkey, and arrested 38 migrants from Syria, six Afghans, and two Iraqis.



Hundreds of Palestinians from Syria have embarked on life-threatening journeys to Greece. Hundreds of others have been stranded on the Turkish territories in anticipation of other journeys onboard the “death boats” to Europe.

According to AGPS data, 50 Palestinian refugees from Syria drowned as their boats sunk into the sea on way to Europe.

The Palestine Charity Commission distributed 200 suhur meals (an Islamic term referring to the predawn meal consumed by Muslims before fasting) to displaced Palestinian families in Yalda, Babila, and Beit Sahem, south of Damascus.

Meanwhile, Palestine Charity continues to provide families displaced from Yarmouk to nearby towns with relief and health services, securing water from wells and AlFija spring on a quasi-daily basis.

In the meantime, a collective break-of-fast dinner was held by the Islamic Organization for Relief of Orphans and the Poor in 1948 Occupied Palestine, in partnership with Khayra Ummah Organization. 300 Palestinian families from Syria in the Turkish cities of Adana, Kilis, Gaziantep, and Reyhanli joined the dinner.

According to the campaigners, the move makes part of underway projects launched by the organization to tone down the crises endured by the displaced Palestinian families from Syria during Ramadan.



Palestinians of Syria: June 8, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,509 Palestinians, including 462 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,603 Palestinian refugees, including 99 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,417 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,152 and 1,003 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,496 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 230 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
