Recent Updates

The helicopters bombed Handarat camp in Aleppo south of Syria with a number of explosive barrels resulted in big destruction in civilians homes, coincided with violent clashes between the Syrian opposition and the Regular Army which was trying to break into the camp and imposing military control on it and its surroundings.

Four explosive barrels dropped on Khan Al Sheih camp targeted Al Isqan cross, the main street and the vicinity of western villas which resulted in a number of injuries and a massive destruction in civilian homes and General and private properties.

Therefore, the residents stressed on not involving the camp in the ongoing conflict in Syria and also emphasized that the camp includes unarmed civilians do not carry any type of weapon, appealing all parties to set aside the camp from scourge of what is happening in Syria. The residents also appealed to all concerned, both International represented by UN and UNRWA, the Palestinian factions and the Palestinian Liberation



Organization, which sees itself as the legitimate representative of the Palestinian people to intervene to lift the injustice and oppression for all residents of the Palestinian refugee camps in Syria, including Khan Al Sheih camp.

On the other hand, a Palestinian popular delegation has entered the Yarmouk camp south of the capital Damascus to discuss the issue of neutralize the camp, lifting its siege and activate the terms of the initiative and revive it, coincided with a popular discontent and restlessness about the failure to reach any serious agreement that will end the crisis. On the other hand, some aids resumed to be distributed yesterday to the people of the Yarmouk refugee camp, coincided with the exit of a number of humanitarian cases to outside the camp.

In the same context, organizations and commissions in the Yarmouk refugee camp demanded the UNRWA to work to end the tragedy and suffering by lifting the siege and allow the introduction of foodstuffs, medicines and fuel just like the surrounding areas that signed a truce with the Syrian regime.

It also held another meeting to discuss the conditions inside the camp, and the functioning of these institutions, in addition to the latest findings of the initiative delegation and work to activate it and make it success.

The participants confirmed the unity of the work and the need for cooperation within the camp.

The Scout camp that was held by a group of Jenin Scout over two days in the Yarmouk refugee camp ended up under the slogan "Gaza has triumphed".

In another context, about 8500 Palestinians in Al Muzaireib town are suffering of difficult humanitarian conditions as a result of high prices and unemployment, referred that Al Muzaireib is a Syrian town with a Palestinian majority and located 11 km north-west of Daraa province.

Meanwhile, a state of relative quite prevailed Khan Dannoun camp coincided with voices of heavy explosions that rocked the camp due to the bombing its surroundings.

In terms of humanitarian aspect, the camp that contains thousands of displaced families, suffers of severe shortage in food stuff and medicine, as well a bread crises due to the loss of flour and fuel.

The residents of the camp are complaining of the high prices and the continuous power and telecommunication cut. It is worth mentioning that Khan Dannoun camp was officially created in 1950-1951, locates 23 KM Northern the Syrian capital "Damascus", an area of 120,000 km² with an estimated population of about 12.000 Palestinian refugees, in addition to 20.000 people have been displaced from the camps of Yarmouk, Sbeneh , Al Sayeda Zainab, Hosseinieh compound, Al Theiabeya town, Al Hajar Al Aswad, Dareia and Khan Al Sheih camp because of the deteriorating security situation in their areas

Missing

The Palestinian Young man "Fady Al Falouji" was missed in 24th of August 2014 while he was heading from Zwara city in Libya to Italy, till now there is no news about him.



It is worth mentioning that the anxiety living situation and the legal position of the Palestinians of Syria refugees who are in Syria, Lebanon, Egypt, Turkey and Libya push them to try to reach the European countries which secure the proper legal and living situation.

Civil Work Committees

Jafra organization distributed about 150 Kg of Molokhia on the residents of the Yarmouk camp. It is worth mentioning that Jafra has made reclamation and cultivation to a number of lands and gardens and planted them with various kinds of vegetables in order to alleviate the impact of siege that is imposed on the camp by the Regular Army and PFGC for more than 400 days.

The Palestine Red Crescent Society performed a nursery course titled as the Martyr Deyab Mohanna nursery procedures course in the Yarmouk camp which lasted for 3 months. The course contains an oral and writing exam and a workshop for the volunteers in the course under the title as “the Active communication in the clinics and hospitals” in the conference hall of the Palestine hospital in the camp.

In turn, the Charity Committee for Relief Palestinian People announced the launch of its relief campaign “Rajein 4” that is scheduled to begin the introduction of food aid to the people of the Yarmouk refugee camp on Monday 01/09/2014.



In Aleppo, Under the Rapid Relief project to secure continues needs, the Charity Committee received the food and relief materials from the Syrian Red Crescent, in preparation to launch a project that distributes about 3000 food packages to the Palestinian families which are registered in its records.

In Lebanon, the Palestininas of Syria committee in Lebanon participated in the ceremony that was performed by Hamas movement on 29th of August 2014 in Ein El Helwa camp. Ismile Redwan, Hamas Political Office Member, and dozens of people participated in the ceremony. The committee also attended another ceremony that was performed by the Islamic Jihad of Palestine because of the victory that the resistance in Gaza achieved in Naji Al Ali Hal in the camp. The both ceremonies insure that the Palestinian people are united inside and out of Palestine and their joy and sadness is one.

Lebanon

A memorandum of understanding (MOU) was signed between the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) and the World Food Program (WFP) whereby both agencies



will support cash for food assistance for Palestine refugees from Syria (PRS) in Lebanon.

"The signing ceremony was hosted by the United Nations Special Coordinator for Lebanon, Mr. Derek Plumbly, in his office in Yarzeh, and was attended by a number of ambassadors and heads of UN agencies in Lebanon," release said. Mr. Plumbly welcomed the generous contribution from WFP aimed at ensuring that PRS receive the food assistance they require. "This is an encouraging example of how cooperation among partners within and outside the UN system can help ease some of the suffering of the Palestinian Refugees from Syria. I hope donors will be inspired by it to help ensure that necessary assistance for vulnerable Palestinian refugees remains available for as long as it is needed," Plumbly said.

Director of UNRWA in Lebanon, Ms. Ann Dismorr, thanked the UN Special Coordinator for hosting the event and WFP for their generous contribution to ensure food security for PRS adding that "The PRS rely heavily on UNRWA's services and are increasingly vulnerable especially since May when further restrictions were introduced and limited their freedom of movement. Furthermore, PRS have limited access to work in Lebanon and for many families, if not most, UNRWA's cash assistance is the only source of income".

On his part, WFP Country Director in Lebanon Mr. Imad Osman Saleh welcomed this new partnership between both agencies to serve the Palestinian refugees adding that: "we are confident that this cooperation will be fruitful and will lead to the improvement of the situation of the Palestinian communities from Syria, especially in terms of food security".

e concluded his remarks by highlighting the need for additional help to keep this assistance sustainable "Assisting refugees or any community in need would require concerted efforts so that we, hand in hand, feed the most vulnerable, with the help of funding agencies, individuals, governments or any funding entity that would kindly contribute to fighting hunger"

Under this agreement, WFP will provide UNRWA with up to 50% of the funds required to ensure that PRS in Lebanon are receiving food assistance through December 2014. The amount credited by UNRWA to
