"A Palestinian Family Detained in Ataturk Airport for 11 Days Appeals For Help"



- Two Palestinians killed and one injured due to mortar shell in Aleppo.
- Warnings from passing it, Syrian Army targets Khan Eshieh Camp's road.
- Humanitarian conditions deteriorate in Qudsaya Town because of the siege.
- Syrian Security forces are still arresting a PRS family for more than two years.
- 37 PRS females missing inside and outside Syria since the beginning of war in Syria.

VICTIMS

A mortar shell hit Ain-Albayda area in Aleppo caused death to both “Hussien Miari” 29-years-old, and “Yassir Qasim” 44-years-old, while “Khaled Abu Hashem” was wounded and transported to Kweris Airport to receive medical treatment before arriving to Military Hospital of Aleppo, it is noteworthy that all of them work as service team in Ain-Albayda governmental water pump.



RECENT UPDATES

Team of "Violations against Palestinian refugees around the world" said that a PRS family of four individuals is detained in Ataturk Turkish airport for 11 days so far, the team said, the family appeals to the PA Embassy in Turkey and to Hamas Movement as well as to the General Authority for refugees to intervene and mediate in order to release them and grant them freedom of movement just like all other refugees fleeing the conflict in Syria.

The family said it has arrived Ataturk Airport in Istanbul Turkey coming from Brazil, which was the previous destination in an attempt to search for a decent life. The family added "we were surprised in the Turkish airport to be stopped and detained in such humiliating conditions where we receive frequent threats of deporting to Syria".



It is noteworthy that another PRS "Basil Azzam" was also arrested recently at Ataturk Airport in Istanbul because of not having the visa imposed on the Palestinian refugees, including those fleeing the war.



After four months of detention at the airport, amid fears of a re-deporting him to Syria or Lebanon which poses a direct threat to his life, "Azzam" announced launching hunger strike, protesting against detention and demanding to allow him to enter Turkey, and to be treated according to international laws and norms with respect to Refugees fleeing conflict zones.

Moving to Western Gota in Damascus, activists through social media, warned of passing Khan Eshieh – Zakya road as it is being targeted frequently by heavy weapons from the regime's army positions.





The Zakya - Khan Eshieh road is the last open road that could supply the camp with essential needs, knowing that all other roads leading to the camp are closed, which forced residents to take the risk and expose themselves to life threats on daily basis.

AGPS' Correspondent said that hundreds of PRS families displaced to Qudsaya are suffering a real tragedy because of the regime's army siege, which reflected negatively on them and their health and living conditions, where the bread cut is one of the major results of siege.

Residents complain, also, of the lack of heating materials in the city, in addition to complete loss of many medications, activists said. While piles of garbage piled up in the streets of the town is another sign of the deterioration of the health situation.

In a different context; the Syrian security is still arresting several Palestinian families and remains reticent about their fate, "Mawloud Khaled Al-Abdullah" a full family arrested on 27 July 2013 on Nesrin street checkpoint near Al-Tadamon Area in Damascus, they are: "Mawloud Khaled Al-Abdullah" 73-year-old the father who has heart disease, "Dieba Al-Ahmad" 65-year-old the mother who has diabetes, "Ilham" 48-year daughter, "Enam" 33-year daughter, "Yasmin" 39-years daughter, and "Obada" 6-year son of Yasmin.





Monitoring and documentation team of AGPS revealed that, at least 37 Palestinian females were lost since the beginning of the conflict where, 22 lost in Damascus province, 4 lost in Damascus Countryside, 5 in Tartous, 2 in Aleppo, 2 in Homs, 2 in Egypt, and 1 in Libya.

It should be noted that the AGPS had documented (444) female victims since the beginning of the conflict in Syria in March 2011 until today.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 10 march 2016

- *15,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan,*
- *6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 999 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1052 days, water cut for 549 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 186 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 855 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1047 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 709 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
