"Wide Condemnation by Families of the PLA Soldiers after their Children Participate in Battles alongside the Regime"

Recent Updates

A state of indignation and anxiety spread among Palestinian refugees in the Palestinian camps and compounds in Syria and abroad after the death of new victims among young Palestinians from the Palestine Liberation Army in Syria, where the number of deaths among the Palestinian Liberation Army members since the start of war events in Syria increased to 182 refugees.

Since the beginning of this month, the PLA announced that 15 fighters died in fighting at Tal Sewan in Adra town - Damascus suburb, while another fighter died in the south of Syria so far, where the PLA fights alongside the Syrian regime forces in confrontations against the armed opposition groups.



Families of the Palestinian victims and soldiers accuse the leadership of the PLA led by his chief of staff "Tariq Alkhadra" of forcing their children to participate in the conflict in Syria, and bloodshed of the Palestinian youth in a battle which is not theirs, and send them away from Palestinian refugee camps and away for their protection.



It should be noted that the Palestinian refugees in Syria are obligated to perform the PLA military service, and everyone who refuse to join it will be prosecuted and jailed. Many young people, who refused to join the PLA during the war in Syria were forced to leave and travel to neighboring countries, while many of the army split and joined the opposition groups to fight against the Syrian regime.

In the meantime, the Palestinian refugees who were displaced from Handarat camp for (1224) days, are still suffering as they were displaced from their homes after the Syrian armed opposition controlled the camp. They are facing harsh living conditions, especially after they were asked to evacuate the ninth unit in the university city in Aleppo, which added to their misery and suffering.

Handarat Camp and the surrounding areas are still exposed to bombing and separate clashes, amid clashes once in a while between the military Opposition and Al Quds Brigade alongside the Regular Army.

The Regular Army is trying to control the camp that forms a strategic point for the Army to go forward to Handarat town and Aleppo Central Prison.





The Syrian Regime Security departments continue to detain the Palestinian child Hadeel Al Eathy, who is 4 years old, and her mother Taghrid Easat since March, 2013, where they were arrested from Al Aalaf checkpoint, which is the Syrian Regime Checkpoint, in Al Hajar Al Aswad area which surrounds Yarmouk Camp and no news about them or their detention conditions.

The Syrian Regime blackout the fate of the mother and her child besides more than 1104 Palestinian detainees, including 75 Palestinian Female refugees, according to AGPS. The testimonies of the released detainees from the Syrian Prisons insured that the detainees were exposed to all kinds of torture starting from beating and hanging to raping.

In Lebanon, the Lebanese General Security allowed the student Aya Tayseer Shehad to return back to Lebanon after being banned to return to Lebanon, where her family lives.



Aya stayed stranded near the Lebanese Syrian borders for several days, where she launched many calls and appeals to the international and human rights organizations and the PLO and the Palestinian factions to interfere to allow her return back to Lebanon after she got out for the primary school exam in Damascus.



In Turn, AGPS published the appeal of the student Aya Shehada to many Palestinian and Lebanese official, popular, and human rights institutions in order to intervene with the Lebanese General Security to allow the student to enter the Lebanese territories.

Civil Work Committees

The Palestine Charity Foundation honored the distinguished female students in the end of Quran Recitation course in Al Sahabi” Zaher Bin Jeram Al Ashja’i “mosque in Al Husayneia Camp in Damascus Suburb, where dozens of students participated in the course after the return of residents to the camp, also the male students of the Holy Quran courses were honored in Shohada’ Al Aqsa mosque in Al Nairab camp with the attendance of the residents of the camp and the dignitaries.

It is referred that the children of the Palestinian refugees suffer from cruel psychological conditions due to the continuation of the ongoing conflict in Syria, where it still has a direct impact on their education, the conflict hugely limited the chances of getting education amongst children and youth.

- *More than 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till mid -2016*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1179 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1240 days, water was cut for 729 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 1032 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1224 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 883 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
