"Human Rights Report of AGPS: 70% of Dara Camp's Buildings Are Destroyed"

RECENT UPDATES

AGPS confirmed, in its human rights report which will be released in the coming days under the title "Palestine refugees in Daraa.. bitter reality and hard choices" that (70%) of the houses of the camp had been destroyed almost entirely due to the shelling and raids targeted the camp.

The human rights report monitors the most important events endured by PRS either inside the camps of Dara or outside such as the town of Al-Muzeireeb, during the time period between March 2011 and the mid of March 2016, through three main sections covered the mentioned areas in terms of location, boundaries, census and the attempts of managing the crisis, not forgetting to provide statistical data on victims and detainees documented by monitoring and documentation team in the AGPS.



Head of Studies Department, Ibrahim Al-Ali, pointed out that the report has been conducted depending on field reports collected through a network of correspondents in the Palestinian camps.

It is noteworthy that the Palestinians in the city of Daraa southern Syria had been affected by the conflict at very early stages, since the outbreak of the Syrian revolution was from the city of Daraa on March 2011.



On the other hand, AGPS' correspondent reported, yesterday, an explosion occurred in Al-Muzeireeb town led to a state of panic among the local people, turned out to be an explosive device planted in the car of the Palestinian refugee "Hamdan Al-Rammah" in an assassination attempt, the reporter assured that the damages were limited to materials, with no injuries.

Anxiety prevails among the people of Muzeireeb Town southern Syria, home to more than (8500) Palestinian refugees, due to the continuation of the assassination attempts, knowing that the doer and the party that stands behind him are anonymous in light of security chaos taking place in the entire region.

Some accused Syrian security forces of being behind the assassinations and planting explosive devices in opposition-controlled areas, while others considered it as "revenge" incidents operated by opposition forces themselves, while other activists accused the foreign intelligence services, which are active in the southern regions of Syria.



On a different topic, the regime's army targeted Khan Eshieh - Zakya road by heavy machine guns, the last road to supply the camp by essential needs, knowing that all other roads leading to the camp are closed by the regime's forces, which forced residents to take the risk of passing this road.



As for the Palestinian prisoners, the Security forces continued detention of the Palestinian refugee "Obaida Alyyan" (24) years. Alyyan was arrested by Syrian regime checkpoint in Al-Zahira area in Damascus on 31 March 2014, noting that he survived the siege of Al-Yarmouk camp before being evacuated by the "Charity Organization for the Relief of the Palestinian people" as he is one of its volunteers.



Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 11 march 2016

- *15,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan,*
- *6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 1000 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1053 days, water cut for 550 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 186 victims.*

- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 855 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1048 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 710 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL-Saieda Zainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and Al-AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al-Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.*
