"The Syrian Security Continues Detaining Entire Palestinian Family for More than Two Years"

Victims

Activists confirmed to the AGPS that the refugee Mahmoud Abdulkareim died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian Regime after being arrested by members of Jaramana checkpoint. He was detained at Sidnaya prison for about 14 months.

According to the activists, the Syrian security informed his family by a phone call that their son is dead and his body will be delivered in two days, in condition not to make funeral.

Arrest

The Syrian security services continues detaining many Palestinian families and reticent about their fate, including the family of "Mawloud Khaled Al-Abdullah."



The family was arrested by members of the Syrian regime checkpoint at Nisreen Street in Al Tadamon neighborhood adjacent to the Yarmouk on 27.07.2013; the family members are:



Father "Mawloud Khaled Al-Abdullah" 73 years, heart patient.

Mother "Thiba Al-Ahmad" 65 years, diabetes patient.

Ilham Mawloud Al-Abdullah 48 years, Enam Mawloud al-Abdullah 33 years, Jasmine MAwloud Al-Abdullah 39 years, and Ubada Abdullah six years, son of Jasmine.

Unconfirmed reports indicated that the families that have been arrested from Al Tadamon neighborhood were detained at a member of one of the Syrian regime of the popular Committees, and other news reported that they are in a Syrian security branch in Damascus, while their fate is unknown yet.

It is noteworthy that the AGPS documented 979 Palestinian prisoners in the prisons of the Syrian regime, including 61 female detainees, while the toll of torture victims in the prisons of the Syrian regime has reached 420 refugees.

Recent Updates

Syrian warplanes targeted the sides of Khan Al Shieh camp and the vicinity of Al Iskanarea with four explosive barrels, causing a state of fear and panic among people and a great destruction in civilian homes.

Meanwhile, all roads linking the camp and the center of the capital Damascus are still closed except "Zakya– Khan Al Shieh," which is exposed to frequent shelling and targeting.



It is worth mentioning that the AGPS documented 137 victims from Khan Al Shieh camp who died since the start of war events in Syria.

On the other hand, the displaced people of the Yarmouk camp in the neighboring town of Babbila organized a victory march for Al Aqsa Mosque after Friday prayers yesterday; people of the town and the displaced people from the Yarmouk camp participated in the march, and they chanted slogans pro-Aqsa Mosque.



It is worth mentioning that hundreds of families of the Yarmouk camp had fled after the storming of ISIS the beginning of last April, with support of



Al-Nusramembers, as they assassinated many activists in the camp, and threatened the rest of them.

Turning to the south of Syria, the remained residents of Daraa camp are suffering of dire living situation, as they were prevented from water owing to the siege imposed by the Syrian regular army forces for 537 days respectively.

Residents have resorted to well water after purchase of tanks, which led to the spread of gastrointestinal and skin diseases because of water pollution, coincided with power outages for long periods, up to 20 hours a day.

This comes amid absence of public utilities and service-and relief team work, which resulted in the spread of rodents dramatically in most of the abandoned and destroyed houses, as well as the stoppage of UNRWA work at the camp and medical centers, which are closed for the second year because of being bombed.

Residents of the camp are complaining of depriving them of food, health care, and financial assistance provided by UNRWA.

Lebanon

The strict procedures practiced by the Lebanese General Security at the Syrian-Lebanese border are still hindering the entry of hundreds of Palestinians in Syria to Lebanon.

Almost 45,000 Palestinian Syrians in Lebanon are suffering from difficult and unstable humanitarian and legal situation, where the Lebanese



authorities do not allow Palestinians of Syria to work systematically within Lebanon, which doubled the psychological pressure and economic burden on the Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon.

In addition to the obvious mood of the Lebanese authorities regarding the renewal of residencies, where they allow extend the residencies of Palestinians of Syria temporarily and only once each period, without having a clear and permanent laws to set that topic.

Europe

Thousands of Palestinian Syrian refugees who risked their lives to get to Europe are suffering from multiple obstacles, most notably the delay of obtaining residency, in addition to the other difficulties they face while completing the procedures of family reunion.

The required period for obtaining residencies in the Nordic European countries ranging between 3 to 9 months, while family reunion decision is taking a similar period, which increases the suffering of the refugees, especially from those who left their families in Syria and who suffer from the security tension situation on the one hand and the high cost of living on the other.

In addition, the difficulty of their families to access to European embassies in neighboring countries, where Lebanon stresses its procedures for the entry of Palestinians, as Turkey stopped issuing entry visas to Palestinian Syrian refugees into its territory for more than two years.



It is noteworthy that at least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees were forced by war to leave their camps in Syria, and the neighboring countries forced them to risk their lives in order to reach the European North.

Numbers and Statistics till 10/10/2015

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 831 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 901 days, water was cut for 391 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 692 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 893 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 537 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
