### *“Dar’aa Camp without Water for 210 Days with the Absence of the UNRWA and the Relief Organizations Services”*



Dar’aa camp

- Winter increases the suffering of Al Nairab Camp residents in Aleppo.
- The Regular Army continues to prevent Al Husayneyya camp residents to return back to their houses.
- Wide spaces were destroyed in Handarat camp.
- The continuation of the strict siege that is imposed on the Yarmouk camp.

### ***Recent Updates***

*The residents of Daraa camp for Palestinian refugees are suffering of a tight water crisis in southern of Syria; water cuts on Daraa camp for 210 days amid the absence of the basic services like hospitals, power and telecommunications. It is mentioned that about 70% of the houses became unsuitable for living due to the violent raids during the last six months, which led hundreds of families to leave to the surrounding areas because they are afraid on their lives.*

*The residents are complaining of the carelessness of the relief organizations and UNRWA for their services in the camp where the aids didn't reach them. The UNRWA distributes aids in the surrounding towns where the residents are not able to reach these towns for fear of being arrest by the checkpoints.*

*On a related context, the suffering of Al Nairab camp for Palestinian refugees in Aleppo is increasing, specially with the coming of the winter season under the severe shortage of fuel where the Gas Cylinder costs 50\$ after doubling its cost for the fifth times, where the wood ton costs 200\$. In addition to unavailability of fuel in the camp despite that The Syrian Government promises to distribute 100 Liter for the families where they distributed to few families then the distribution was stopped. The power Generators operators minimized the hours to be 5 to 6 hours a day.*

*On a different side, the members of the Regular army and the affiliated Palestinian factions prevented the residents of Al Husayneyya camp to return back to their houses for 395 days after violent clashes between the Opposition groups and the Regular army which forced the residents to leave the camp. The displacement added more burdens to the refugees, specially the high costs of rent houses and the spread of unemployment.*

*In Aleppo, Handarat camp was exposed to a mass destruction in some parts of the camp due to violent raids after the Syrian Opposition controlled the camp. The raids damaged all the camp's houses and most of them became unsuitable for living. The camp was exposed to frequent targeting by explosive barrels and shells. It is mentioned that the residents left the camp 564 days ago after the violent clashes between the Opposition and the regular army which ended with the control of the Opposition over the camp.*

*In Damascus, the Regular army and the PFGC are still imposing a strict siege on the Yarmouk camp for 493 days respectively, where their checkpoints prevent the entry of food materials and fuel to the camp. The suffering of the residents is increasing with the continuation of the water cut for 63 days respectively amid power cut for more than 576 days.*

### ***The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics***

- ***The Yarmouk Camp:*** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for **493** days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than **576** days, water was cut for **63** days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached **155** victims.
- **41** Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria .
- **93** PLO members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.
- **Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **395** days respectively.
- **Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **364** days respectively.



- **Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for **563** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- **Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost **210** days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- **Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
- **Khan Danoun Camp:** - Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- **Al Nairab Camp:** - Power is still cut for more than a year.
- **Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
