Victims

The three Palestinian refugees, "Hamid Nassif Almisawi" 70 years, and his wife "Azra Almisawi" 65 years, and "Khaldia Kamal Saied Subaihi," 25 years, died due to shelling that targeted Muzareeb compound in Daraa with explosive barrels.

Meanwhile, the 17-year- Palestinian refugee "Raghad Mohammed Saleh Aboud" died, while her father and dozens of Palestinians and Syrians were injured by the Turkish army fire while trying to cross the Syrian-Turkish border from Khirbet Jouz area in Idlib suburb near the Turkish territory. The refugees were escaping the furnace of the war raging in Syria.

The AGPS received news that the Turkish military - the gendarmerie - arrested and beaten dozens of refugees, while some of them escaped and were shot.

Some refugees estimated the number of injuries with 10 and dozens of detainees are still at the border in difficult humanitarian conditions.

Moreover, three Palestinian refugees from Al Aedein camp in Homs died; they are:

"Ali Hamid," and his two wives, "Zada Sheikh Khalil," and "Zahra Hindi," drowned off the coast of Libya, on Wednesday, August 5 while trying to immigrate to the European States searching for safety and security.

In the meantime, the young man, "Mohammed Ibrahim Hosan" from Daraa camp died as a result of clashes between the Syrian armed opposition forces and the regular army. It was mentioned that Ibrahim is fighting alongside the Syrian opposition Brigades in Daraa.

Recent Updates

Syrian warplanes dropped a number of rockets at the town of Muzeireeb which is located just ten kilometers to the north-west of Daraa city southern Syria, home to about 8,500 Palestinian refugees.

The shelling resulted in a number of victims: some of them were recognized, they are: the elderly, "Hamid Nassif Almisawi," 70 years old, his wife "Azra Almisawi," 65-year-old, and the young woman "Khaldia Kamal Said Subaih," 25 years. In addition, the shelling caused a large number of civilian casualties, as well as massive destruction of buildings and property.

Muzeireeb town lives in a state of tension and anger because of the continuous bombing with explosive barrels that led to a number of casualties among civilians. Several months ago, a school for children was bombed and resulted in casualties among civilians, mostly children.

Violent clashes broke out on several contact lines in Yarmouk, south of the Syrian capital Damascus, yesterday between the Syrian army alongside groups loyal to it and armed opposition groups. The pro-regime groups stationed in Alqaa' buildings fired explosive bullets by medium weapons toward Thalathein Street, coincided with sound of explosions rocked parts of the camp turned out to be resulted of the GC bombing that targeted a number of buildings on Rama Road.

In a different context, and within the activities of "Save the Yarmouk besieged camp," which was called for by institutions and agencies working in the camp a few days ago, a session for the disabled and



elderly was held in the youth support center, as well as drawing activity for Yarmouk children in the youth support Center at Madares Street.

In the middle of Syria, the AGPS correspondent from inside Alaedein camp in Homs reported news that the Syrian security prevented family of the Palestinian refugee "Ammar Omar Touba," who died on 08.08.2015 at the Turkish-Syrian border after a sudden heart attack, from carrying out his funeral. Noting that he is in the middle of his thirties, and originally from Safoureya village in Palestine.

Detainees

The Syrian security forces arrested the Palestinian refugee "Ayman Mohammed Khattab" from Al Aedein camp in Homs, on August 6 after storming his house and his shop, while our correspondent could not assure the reasons for his arrest. Khattab is at the beginning of his sixties, and originally from Ein Al Zaytoun village in Palestine.

"Mahmoud Darwish Shaloun," in his forties, originally from Acre city in Palestine, was also arrested by the Political Security on August 9 after a raid on his home in Al Aedein camp in Homs.

Action Group for Palestinians of Syria

Under the title "The Palestinians of Syria, Bloody Diary and Unheard Screaming," the AGPS in cooperation with PRC in London issued this morning the documentary report of the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria from January 2015 till June 2015.

The report dealt with the tragedy of Palestinians of Syria through five axes that were distributed to 133 pages, first and second axes dealt with the situation in the Palestinian camps and compounds in Syria and its people suffering from the scourge of war during the first half of 2015.

The third axis highlighted the Palestinian Syrian victims who died during the first half of 2015, totaling over that period (303) victims, out of (2910) victims of Palestinian Syrian refugees who died until the end of June (2015), according to the AGPS statistics.

The axis included statistics for Palestinian Syrian victims classified by date, time, and cause of death, in addition to a detailed list of 78 torture



victims who were identified through the leaked images of the Syrian prisons or through testimonies of some released detainees.



The fourth axis discussed the situation of displaced Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon, Turkey, and Europe, and living and legal problems they face in these countries.

The fifth axis was allocated to address immigration issues, risks, and problems facing the Palestinian Syrian refugees during their search for safety.

It is noteworthy that the report was based on monitoring and follow-up operations carried out by the AGPS through correspondents field network and a group of researchers and those interested in the Palestinian issue, and to document the important stage of the Palestinian refugees, and the preparation of necessary documents for the defense of refugee's rights in local, regional, and international forums.

Numbers and Statistics till 10/8/2015

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 769 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 839 days, water was cut for 329 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.*
- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 650 days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 631 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 832 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 476 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
