### *"On the 800 Day of Siege, Residents of Yarmouk Demand lifting it and Withdrawal of Militants"*



- A PLA Officer Died and Another Injured at Tal Kurdi Battles

### ***Victims***

*The Palestinian refugee Bilal Abdullah, a resident of Khan Dannon Camp and a PLA officer, died during violent clashes against opposition armed groups at Tal Kurdi area.*

*Meanwhile, media sources reported the injury of three other officers from Khan Al Shieh camp during the same clashes.*

*The young man Nour Hasan, a PLA soldier, was injured in the head during violent clashes that broke out between PLA members and groups of the armed opposition at Tal Kurdi area, eastern Ghouta, Damascus Suburb.*

*It is worth mentioning that the AGPS documented 142 PLA victims; most of them died during clashes at separate areas in Damascus suburb.*

*The Palestinian female refugee Zahra Abdulaziz -Em Mohammed-, from Handarat camp in Aleppo, died at the end of last august after she went into a coma due to a heart disease while she was in Kilis city-Turkey. She was transferred to a hospital at Gaziantep after performing an open heart*



*surgery, and then she went into a 5-day-coma and died, as she was buried at Kilis cemetery.*

*Em Mohammed has fled her camp in Syria due to Shelling, siege, and clashes searching for secure, yet she did not bear the bitterness of the second asylum.*



### ***Recent Updates***

*On the 800 day of tight siege imposed on Yarmouk by the regular army and PFGC groups, residents of Yarmouk renewed their demand to lift the siege, to allow the return of displaced residents to their homes, the return of normal life to the camp, and the withdrawal of armed groups.*

*This comes in light of the continued suffering from power cuts for more than 870 days, water cuts for 360 days, and prevention of all food and medical aid entry to the camp, which claimed the lives of nearly 180 victims who died as a result of starvation and lack of medical care.*

*In addition to the shelling with explosive barrels, rockets, and mortar shells, which resulted in 1222 victims who were documented by the AGPS, as well as the mass destruction in homes, particularly the entrance of the camp area.*

*The suffering of residents increased following the control of ISIS and Nusra over the besieged camp since the beginning of April, which gave a pretext for the Syrian regime and other groups to target the camp and*



*follow the policy of systematic destruction of the camp, according to some activists.*



#### ***Yarmouk camp***

*Displaced people are also prevented to return to their homes, as the remained residents are still suffering of the high cost of living, houses' rents, high prices, limited financial resources, and the spread of unemployment among them, as well as the prosecution of security services to them, either for being security wanted, or fleeing from the PLA military service.*

*The suffering of besieged and displaced residents are exacerbating due to the siege imposed by the Syrian regime and its groups, in addition to the control of ISIS and Nusra over the camp, putting the residents in a difficult and tough choices, according to them.*

#### ***Malaysia***

*A number of activists and the family of "Ibrahim Abu Kharij," a Palestinian Syrian refugee from Yarmouk, appealed international organizations and Palestinian institutions in order to work for his release*



*after being detained in a Malaysia Airport. They also called for the need to move before being deported to Syria, what constitutes danger to his life.*

*Dozens of Palestinian Syrian refugees suffer from difficulty of obtaining legal residency in Malaysia, due to the tightening of laws relating to the Malaysian residencies, making most of them vulnerable to detention by the authorities there.*



### ***Release***

*Ahrar Alsham group of the Syrian armed opposition released the 18-year- Palestinian Mahdi Mohammed Naji after being detained for 2 days at Sermein town at Idlib suburb while he was heading to Turkey. He is from Nairab camp in Aleppo.*

### ***Numbers and Statistics till 10/9/2015***

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*

- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 800 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 870 days, water was cut for 360 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 180 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 662 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 863 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 507 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
