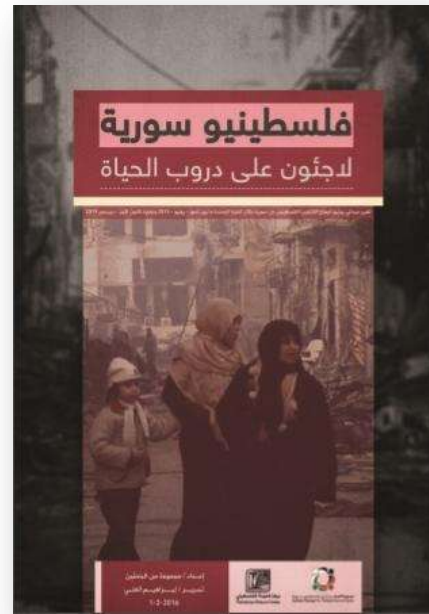

Titled "Palestinians of Syria.. Refugees on The Road of Life", Action Group for Palestinians of Syria AGPS and Palestinian Return Centre PRC have issued the biannual report for the second half of 2015. The new report explains the state of Palestinians of Syria during the last six months of 2015 in and outside Syria.

The 146-Page report reveals important statistics of victims and displaced people. The report mentions that 3089 Palestinian victims died until last December, 1200 of them in Al-Yarmouk camp only. It is indicated that the figures in the report cover the entire period of the Syrian conflict from March 2011.

The number of displaced Palestinians stands at 200 thousand out of the country. While 71.2 thousands managed to reach Europe, the report said. In addition, the situation of Palestinian camps in Syria, where 3 camps are under siege, the report states the amount of destruction in Palestinian camps owing to military actions, where it reached to 70% in some camps such as Dara'a.

The 3-chapter report documents the violations and events that happened during the six months period specified in the report. Relying on a reliable methodology, the report perceives the reality of living, humanitarian and health aspects in these camps. In addition to the most prominent daily





events which passes those places and people, from the bombing and destruction to arrests.

The report addresses the general situation of the displaced Palestinians outside Syria, either in the neighbouring countries or the countries where they have migrated to.

It is indicated that the current report monitors the most important events in the second half of 2015. Three reports had preceded which documented the events over the course of 2014 and the first half of 2015. In addition, the comprehensive report of the Palestinians state prior 2014.

RECENT UPDATES

In Khan Esheih camp, a fighter of opposition groups was executed. The fighter, who fired locals resulting in two casualties, was captured by another armed group, according to AGPS correspondence. The two victims, from Aknaf Baiet Almakdis brigades, were unarmed as they shot, the correspondence assured.





In a different context, Khan Esheih camp has subjected to bombing by two mortars targeting different areas where caused some material damages.

In Al-Yarmouk camp, the family of kidnapped activist "Mohammed Mawed" has appealed for its son to be released. The heart-broken family called for any information about his fate, as it pledged to not reveal the source. Mohammed, a volunteer in the Red Crescent, was kidnapped in Al-Yarmouk camp 15 days ago. The kidnappers are still hidden, and no information about them.

These events come in the light of targeting the activists and tension between Al-Nosra Front and ISIS in Al-Yarmouk camp. The both factions are excused by involving in several assassinations which targeted activists in the camp. It is worth mentioning that Al-Yarmouk camp is still under siege imposed by Syrian regime and FPLP-GC for the 971st. Electric and running water supplies are cut off for (1033, 521 days) respectively.

In Gaza strip, the Organisation of The Common Coordination, announced for protests in a wake of news about special program in Gaza. The organisation specialised in Palestinians affairs from Syria, Yemen and Libya in Gaza, said it tries to put pressure for Palestinians from those countries to be engaged in the program.

The organisers said: "series of protests will start due to the ignorance of our plight by government and other responsible entities", the organisers continued that there is no seriousness in order to finding a viable solution for 400 Palestinian families from Syria, Yemen and Libya.



Palestinians from Syria in Gaza had demanded earlier the Palestinian factions, PLO and Palestinian government, in addition to international organisations to protect Palestinians in the Arab states, and their basics to be met. In the meantime, they demanded for their cash to be received according to a decision had been adopted by the cabinet.

It is noteworthy that hundreds of Palestinians reached Gaza strip in the wake of the outbreak of the conflict in Syria. Owing to the disastrous conditions in Gaza strip after three wars in six years, the plight of Palestinians from Syria exacerbated.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 11 February 2016

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.*

- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 971 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1033 days, water cut for 521 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 187 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 827 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1020 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 681 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.*
