Latest Developments

Reporting from southern Syria, AGPS news correspondent said the Palestinian female refugee Aesha Mohamed AlAyedi died on Friday in an onslaught rocking ALSahari neighborhood, in Deraa ALMahatta, in southern Syria.

Over recent months, deadly hostilities in Deraa, among other southern Syria territories, have been on the rise. At the same time, ISIS-affiliated Khaled Ibn AlWalid battalion has been striving to grab hold of opposition-led zones in the area.



In another development, a state of terror swamped Burj AlBarajneh Camp, in Beirut, as a result of the security mayhem that flared up in the area following clashes between Lebanese nationals from Al Jaafar family and Palestinian young men from AlKafas family.

Heavy machinegun and rocket-propelled grenades along with sniper attacks were recorded in the clashes, leaving a number of refugees dead and others wounded.



Speaking with AGPS, Palestinian refugees from Syria expressed deep concern over the deadly repercussions of the security turmoil.

350 Palestinian families from Syria have sought shelter in AlBarajneh Camp after they fled war-torn Syria for fear of being killed in the raging warfare. Dozens fled the camp via the “death-boats” while others returned to Syria, having no other place to take cover in.



Meanwhile, Palestinian refugees from Syria who have been stranded in Greece have sounded distress signals after most European states opted for a closed-door immigration policy, leaving hundreds of refugees trapped in underequipped makeshift refugee camps.

Speaking with AGPS, Palestinian refugees in Greece said they have been subjected to medical neglect and poor hygiene along with the lack of relief assistance and the propagation of poisonous reptiles in the makeshift tents they have been locked up in.

An agreement between Turkey and Greece to tighten grip on refugees from Syria trying to creep into the Greek territories via the Turkish borders has made the situation far worse.



Palestinians of Syria: March 11, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,458 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,173 Palestinian refugees, including 83 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,358 days in a row.*
- *190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,064 and 872 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,408 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 142 days.*
- *Government troops ban residents of AlSbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,213 days running.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid-2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
