Victims

Two Palestinian brothers—Ahmed and Fayez Mansour—were pronounced dead on May 23, 2017 during clashes between the pro-government Liwaa AlQuds battalion and ISIS militias in Syria's central district of Tadmur. The casualties were residents of AlNeirab Camp, in Aleppo.

AGPS documented the death of 3,513 Palestinian refugees in war-torn Syria.



Latest Developments

Residents of Daraa Camp and AlMenshiya have appealed to all humanitarian institutions to urgently step in and rally round the homeless civilians who have been displaced from Daraa city.

The displaced residents continue to sound distress signals over the tragic situation they have been made to endure due to the deadly shelling rocking the area.



Reporting from the scene, AGPS correspondent said residential neighborhoods in Daraa city have gone devastated due to the massive destruction inflicted by the rampant shelling on civilian homes and buildings.

The Syrian government forces have showered Daraa Camp and AlSadd Road with over 10 surface-to-surface missiles and several barrel bombs, resulting in heavy material damage.



Meanwhile, violent clashes flared up in Palestine and AlSporat streets in Yarmouk Camp between AlKara'in battalion and pro-government troops. At the same time, a flock of fighter jets kept hovering over the territory.

Reports have emerged on the imminent withdrawal of Tahrir AlSham fighters from Yarmouk Camp and AlKadam, according to statements by pro-government sources and Tahrir AlSham affiliates. At the same time, ISIS militias are expected to retreat from southern Damascus sometime soon.



In a related development, 15-year-old Palestinian child Jihad Ata Dwei'er was kidnapped on Saturday, June 10, by the Syrian government forces from his family home in Khan AlSheih Camp.

At least four children were kidnapped by the government forces since early June. On June 4, three students sheltered in the camp—Nizar Sa'id AlNader, Mahmoud Jamil Noufel, and Ahmed Mahmoud Ibrahim—were kidnapped by the regime troops on their way to Artouz to take exams.

In the meantime, the Palestinian Red Crescent Society distributed food baskets to a number of Palestinian families from Syria in AlBadawi Camp, in the Lebanese city of Tripoli.

The move, sponsored by the Kuwaiti Red Crescent, makes part of underway endeavors to assuage the calamitous state of affairs endured by the displaced Palestinian refugees from Syria.

Palestinians of Syria: June 11, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,513 Palestinians, including 462 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,603 Palestinian refugees, including 99 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,420 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*

- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,155 and 1,006 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,499 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 233 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
