“Dogs Dug-up the Collapsed Graves, and an Old Man Was Found Faint Under Snow at the Yarmouk Camp”

Recent Updates

A number of graves at the Yarmouk cemetery in Damascus were collapsed due to the accumulation of snow above them, in addition to some new graves that was covered with dust without putting a flagstone, due to the lack of basics materials because of the siege, which led to the collapsing of these graves and exposing some corpse that was dug by street dogs.

On the other hand, an old man was found faint yesterday due to starving and cold at the schools street, while snow covered a part of his body and the residents transferred him to the hospital for having urgent treatment.

Meanwhile, a group of Palestinian youth sit-in at the Yarmouk camp to express their anger about the continuous siege of the regular army and the Palestinian groups loyal to it for 555 days, and to protest about preventing the entry of food and medical aids, and the cut of power and water.

The protestors appealed the concerned parties, the PLO, and the armed groups inside the Yarmouk camp to enter aids and work to secure the road for that.

This comes after news about some victims due to the lack of medical care, the spread of starvation, and the increasing demand of food and aids amongst the streets and alleys of the camp after the severe suffering of the bitter cold and the lack of heating methods.

The Palestinian refugees warned, during their sit-in, of a humanitarian catastrophe if the food and medical aids continue to be prevented, the most prominent slogans was " the Bullet missed us, while starvation arrow hit us".

In the same context, five Arabic channels unit their broadcast to shed the light at the Yarmouk residents suffering, through "Freedom Call" program which will address the suffering of the camp's residents and the return of starvation. The five channels are; Al Quds Satellite Channel, Yarmouk Channel, Khartoum Channel, Al Watan Algerian Channel, and Sanaa Channel, will unit its broadcasting today Monday 12-1-2015 at 10:00 pm Damascus timing, the episode will include phone calls from indie the camp to explain the residents' suffering.

On the other hand, monitoring and documentation team of the AGPS announced that it documented, till today, the death of 2600 Palestinian victims were killed during the ongoing war in Syria, while the AGPS confirmed that 159 Palestinian victims died due to the strict siege imposed by the regular army and the PFGC groups at the Yarmouk camp, as 286 others were killed due to torture in the Syrian regime prisons.

Meanwhile, the PLO political bureau published, through its website, the names of the Palestinian refugees who were released from the Syrian prisons on 9-1-2015 after they were delivered to the PLO, which in turn delivered them to their families.



The released refugees are; Ghassan Mahmoud Bargouthi, Wael Fouad Al Saadi, Ahmed Mohammed Al Maagal, Raed Mohammed Wadi, Mahmoud Ahmed Yasein, Ayman Ibrahim Al Masri, Mohammed Ahmed Zainab, Abdulrahman Rashed Khader, Ahmed Hasan Ghowaini, Mohammed, Suhair Mohammed Al Saadi, who was transferred to the court for her release.

It is mentioned that there are no official statistics about the number of the Palestinian detainees in the Syrian prisons since the beginning of the war in Syria, but estimates indicated that there are about 1200 Palestinian Syrian detainees in the Syrian prisons, while the AGPS documented the names of 738 Palestinian refugee detained from all areas in Syria, and 286 victims died due to torture in the Syrian prisons.

In Libya, news were received about the detention of 35 Palestinian Syrian young men and 3 children at Zowara area near Zawraa south west of Libya three days ago, as the news reported that the refugees exposed to looting at gunpoint, and being treated cruelly after being deprived of food and being deprived of food and connect with their relatives.

It is noted that all detain refugees escaped form the war in Syria and enter Lebanon then Sudan the Libya in the journey of reaching Europe and they are in Zowara for a month and a half being manipulated by human traffickers



However, Libya is considered the most prominent station for the Palestinian and Syrian refugees and others to reach to European



countries through small fishing boats that are lack to the minimum safety conditions. In addition to the smuggling traders, who load the boat with the maximum number of refugees regardless their lives, which led to the death of hundreds of them at the sea, taking advantage of the security chaos in Libya and the increasing number of the refugees and threaten them with gunpoint.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 10/1/2015:-

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *2600 Palestinian refugees were documented by the AGPS including 157 women, 286 were killed due to torture, 267 were killed by sniper shot, 84 refugees were field executed, and 985 refugees were killed due to bombing.*
- ***The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 554 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 634 days, water was cut for 124 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 159 victims.*
- *80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 14348 refugees in Jordan, 42,000 in Lebanon, according to UNRWA statistics till November 2014.*
- ***Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 456 days respectively.*
- ***Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 426 days respectively.*
- ***Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for 627 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- ***Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost 271 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- ***Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- ***Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
