“Egyptian Authorities Continues Detaining more than 100 Refugee from Syria amid Fears of Deportation”



Detainees held by Egyptian authorities

- **Bombing on the Yarmouk camp and the vicinity of Khan Dannoun.**
- **A Palestinian refugee was died due to wounded he attained in Jordan for not being able to has treatment.**
- **The siege victims' toll has been raised to 156 after an old woman died due to the lack of medical care.**
- **A volunteer in the RCS was killed due to the bombing that targeted Hasiaa area.**
- **The Palestinian refugees in the Yarmouk camp commemorate the tenth anniversary of the death of Yasser Arafat.**
- **The Action Group: 58 victims from Sbeina camp were killed since the beginning of the events in Syria.**

Victims

The Palestinian refugee Nasir Izat, was born in Houran, AL Yarmouk neighborhood in Daraa, was died due to a heart attack. It is mentioned that he was injured due to the bombing that targeted Daraa camp and transferred to Jordan to receive treatment after his health condition was severely deteriorated as a result of the rotten that infected his foot. Izat was fighting alongside with the armed Syrian opposition forces. Meanwhile the old woman Insaf NAjeib Abbasi, 63 years was died due to the lack of medical care, as a result of the continuous siege on the Yarmouk camp, which raises the victims' toll of siege, which is imposed by regular army and groups of the PFGC, to 156 victims. In a related context, the RCS funeral refugee Mohammed Ahmed Othman from Al Aedein camp in Hama, as he died due to the injury by Mortar shell that was dropped in Hasiaa area.

Egypt

Egyptian authorities continue to detain more than one hundred Palestinian and Syrian refugees, including women and children, that was after they have fallen victim to a scam by one of the smugglers in Turkey, where they agreed with him to lead them to European shores, but their journey ended up at the Egyptian beaches. They were arrested and were taken to Karmouz police station amid fears that the Egyptian authorities will deport them to Syria, while a number of detained refugees have expressed concern that the Egyptian authorities will deport them, after a Palestinian embassy representatives told them in Cairo that no options in



front of them but deportation to Syria or stay in prison. According to one of the detained refugees, deported to Syria poses major threats, especially many of young people are wanted to military service.

Recent Updates

The Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees was exposed to bombing that targeted the Yarmouk Municipality vicinity with heavy shells that led to injuries and material damages; there were no injuries amongst the residents. On the other hand the Palestinian refugees in the Yarmouk camp celebrated the 10th annual anniversary for the death of the former Palestinian presidents Yasser Arafat in the Youth Center in the camp with the attendance of a lot of the relief organizations directors. It is mentioned that the camp is under the siege, which is imposed on the camp by the Regular Army and the PFGC, for more than 494 days in addition to the water cut for 64 days.

In Damascus Suburb, Al Tiba town , which is near Khan Danoun camp for Palestinian refugees, was exposed to bombing that led to the spread of worry state amongst the residents where the surrounding areas witness increase in the rate of military operations during the last weeks. It is



mentioned that the camp receives hundreds of Palestinian families who left their camps due to bombing, siege and clashes. In Aleppo, a group of the military Opposition released the young man Mahmoud Al Naji from Al Nairab camp after being arrested for two days. It is mentioned that the youth of the camp were forced to leave to Turkey because of the security tensions which spread their areas where Al Nairab camp is considered one of the strategic areas in Aleppo because it is close to Al Nairab Military Airport of the Syrian Regular Army.

Statistics

The Action Group for Palestinians of Syria documentation team announced that the number of the Palestinians from Al Sbeina camp who died since the beginning of the events is 58 victims, 88% Men, at a rate of 51 men and 12% women at a rate of 7 women. The team also documented 37 refugees died due to bombing and shells on different parts of the camp.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics

- ***The Yarmouk Camp:*** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for **494** days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than **577** days, water was cut for **64** days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached **156** victims.
- ***41*** Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria.
- ***93*** PLA members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.
- ***Al Husayneyya Camp:*** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **396** days respectively.
- ***Al Sbeina Camp:*** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **365** days respectively.
- ***Handarat Camp:*** - Residents have left the camp for **565** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- ***Dara'a Camp:*** - It is now almost **211** days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- ***Khan Al Sheih Camp:*** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.

- ***Khan Danoun Camp:*** - Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- ***Al Nairab Camp:*** - Power is still cut for more than a year.
- ***Jermana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:*** - A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
