“A Number of Mortar Shells were dropped at the Yarmouk Camp...Activists Warn of Environment Disastrous Due to the Continuous Shelling”

Victims

"Izz Al Dein Saliem", 67 years, was killed by sniper shot while he was waiting to receive aids, that was supposed to be distributed to the people of the camp who are besieged for about a year and a half.

The young man "Hamam Theiab", 28 years, was killed due to torture in the Syria regime prisons, he is from the Yarmouk camp in Damascus and was arrested while trying to reach Turkey, and he is a commerce and economic graduate from Damascus University.

It is mentioned that the number of victims who were killed due to torture and who were documented by the AGPS has reached 279 victims.

Recent Updates

Violent bombing targeted Al Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus yesterday, where the missiles targeted separate areas of the camp, the damages were just material coincided with the shooting of the old man Ezildein Saleem 67 years old while he was waiting for getting the food aids that the UNRWA was supposed to distribute on the Yarmouk residents on Rama street.



A number of activists from the Yarmouk camp warns from an internal environment disaster due to the collapse of some buildings because of the continuation of bombing and clashes in all its parts. Some buildings were fallen in the last weeks because of the artillery and mortar shells that led to weaken the basis of buildings.

The activists insured that there are tens of buildings which are threatened to fall in any moment and it forms danger on the lives of the civilians. The Yarmouk residents are still complaining of the water cut for 94 days respectively where they are obliged to secure limited quantities of water from the surrounding areas which increases their suffering specially with the power cut for more than a year and a half in addition to the prevention of the Regular Army and PFGC checkpoints to enter the basic materials.

The residents of Khan Al Sheih camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus Suburb are suffering of great difficulties of securing fuel due to the unavailability of these materials in the markets, In addition to the repeated closure of the roads linking between the camp and the city center forcing the residents to use primitive ways in cooking and heating such as fire wood heater.

In a related context, Al Sayyeda Zainab camp witnessed several living problems which are concentrated in the economic side such as the high prices of houses and food supplies. It is mentioned that the camp is considered one of the Palestinian camps that is relatively quiet, since the Regular Army is fully controlling the camp while its checkpoints are spread in the entrances and the surrounding areas.

The AGPS announced that the number of Palestinian Syrian victims in Sayeda Zeinab Palestinian refugee camp in Damascus suburb since the beginning of the Syrian events has reached 40 refugees, according to the statistics documented by the documentation team of the AGPS.

On the other hand, residents of Al Aedein camp in Hama are living in a state of relative calm in the light of the continued economic suffering that make up the leading causes of unemployment, in addition to the high cost of living and high rents of houses, especially after the displacement of many residents of areas surrounding the camp to escape the shelling and clashes.



While Al Aedein camp in Hama has seen, in recent times, any irregular event except for one incident on 9th of September 2014, while an explosive device intended for the bombing near the main entrance, where it was dismantled and detonated by members of the regular army military engineering unit, but on 12th of November 2014, the Syrian security forces have released the young man, "Abdel-Rahman Subhia" was born in 1981, from Al Aedein camp in Hama, where he was detained for about a year.

Gaza Strip

A number of Syrian Palestinian families who arrived in the Gaza Strip to escape the conflict in Syria protest and condemn the "dire humanitarian situation" in which they live.

The sitters in the vigil, organized by the "Joint Coordination of refugees from Arab countries in the Gaza body", in front of the headquarters of the Council of Ministers, stressed to provide job opportunities for them, and solving their problems, as they accused each of the "Ministry of Social Affairs, the PLO, the UNRWA, and civil institutions and international organizations working in Gaza, "dereliction of the right of refugees who fled the conflict in Syria to the Gaza Strip.



While more than "260" Palestinian Syrian family in Gaza Department of the Palestine demanded Liberation Organization for Refugees to take responsibility towards them, especially with regard to its role to provide adequate housing for them, and sources of income fixed to provide a decent life, and education that is free university, also called the Minister of Social Affairs to form committee to address this file and ensure their inclusion in the Palestinian society and have access to the national figure, referred to the number of Palestinian refugees who fled from the hell of war in Syria and returned to the Gaza Strip is estimated at about 1,000 people, according to the Ministry of Social Affairs and UNRWA and the PLO.



The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 12/12/2014

- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 524 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 605 days, water was cut for 94 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 157 victims.*
- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 426days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 396 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 596 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 241 days without water and a complete absence of basic services.*

- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.*
- *Khan Danoun Camp: - Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.*
- *Al Nairab Camp: - Power is still cut for more than a year.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.*
